1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the Teacher Preparation in Literacy
2	and Numeracy for Primary Grades Task Force.
3	WHEREAS, teacher preparation programs at Kentucky's colleges and universities
4	are dedicated to preparing undergraduate and graduate students to become licensed
5	teachers; and
6	WHEREAS, elementary and secondary students in Kentucky's public schools
7	deserve teachers who are well-prepared and effective at delivering instruction in the
8	classroom; and
9	WHEREAS, Kentucky's primary students continue to struggle with reaching
10	proficiency in reading and mathematics, with only 52.7% of third grade students reaching
11	proficiency in reading and only 47.4% of third grade students reaching proficiency in
12	mathematics for the 2018-2019 school year; and
13	WHEREAS, Kentucky's General Assembly endeavors to elevate policies to ensure
14	every student achieves proficiency in reading and mathematics by the end of third grade;
15	NOW, THEREFORE,
16	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
17	Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
18	→Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the Teacher
19	Preparation in Literacy and Numeracy for Primary Grades Task Force to study Kentucky's
20	teacher preparation programs and professional development opportunities and make
21	recommendations for improvements to the Kentucky General Assembly by December 1,
22	2020.
23	$\Rightarrow$ Section 2. The duties of the task force shall include but are not limited to:
24	(1) Conducting a thorough examination of opportunities to improve Kentucky's
25	teacher preparation programs and teacher professional development to better educate
26	teachers on how to teach literacy and numeracy in the primary grades;
27	(2) Evaluating delivery methods to effectively assist teachers in acquiring

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knowledge and skills in early literacy and numeracy for grades kindergarten through third
 grade;

3 Reviewing the many areas that impact a teacher's ability to effectively provide (3) 4 instruction in literacy and numeracy, including but not limited to licensure requirements 5 for teachers, qualifications of teachers and candidates for teaching, alternative pathways 6 to licensure, practice-based assessments, clinical practices such as student teaching and 7 mentorships, design and quality of teacher preparation programs, data systems, retention 8 of graduates from teacher preparation programs in the Commonwealth, effective 9 professional learning strategies, and effective partnerships between local school districts 10 and colleges and universities.

Section 3. The Teacher Preparation in Literacy and Numeracy for Primary
Grades Task Force shall be composed of the following members, with final membership
of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of the Legislative
Research Commission:

- 15 (1) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the
  16 House of Representatives who shall be designated as a co-chair of the task force;
- 17 (2) One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the Minority Floor18 Leader of the House of Representatives;
- (3) One member of the Senate appointed by the President of the Senate who shallbe designated as a co-chair of the task force;
- 21 (4) One member of the Senate appointed by the Minority Floor Leader of the22 Senate;
  - (5) The commissioner of the Department of Education or designee;

24 (6) The associate commissioner of the Office of Educator Licensure and
25 Effectiveness or designee;

- 26 (7) The president of the Council on Postsecondary Education or designee;
- 27 (8) The vice president for academic affairs and student success of the Council on

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1 Postsecondary Education or designee; 2 (9) Two elementary school principals designated by the commissioner of the 3 Department of Education; 4 (10) Two elementary school teachers designated by the commissioner of the 5 Department of Education; 6 (11) Four members designated by the president of the Council on Postsecondary 7 Education representing colleges of education at public universities; and 8 (12) Two members designated by the president of the Council on Postsecondary 9 Education representing schools of education at private colleges and universities. 10 → Section 4. The task force shall meet monthly during the 2020 Interim of the 11 General Assembly. The task force shall submit findings and recommendations to the 12 Legislative Research Commission for referral to the appropriate committees 13 by December 1, 2020. 14  $\Rightarrow$  Section 5. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the 15 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the 16 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to 17 designate a study completion date.

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
