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1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION establishing the Property Valuation
2	Administrator's Office Task Force.
3	WHEREAS, Section 99 of the Kentucky Constitution requires every county to elect
4	a surveyor and an assessor; and
5	WHEREAS, the property valuation administrator's office is essential in the ad
6	valorem taxation process; and
7	WHEREAS, KRS 132.220 requires property to be assessed on January 1 of the tax
8	year, and KRS 132.690 requires every parcel in the Commonwealth to be examined at
9	least once every four years by the property valuation administrator; and
10	WHEREAS, adequate staffing and equipment are necessary for the property
11	valuation administrator's office to assess property within the Commonwealth at fair cash
12	value as required by Section 172 of the Kentucky Constitution; and
13	WHEREAS, the property valuation administrator's office receives limited funding
14	in which to operate through appropriations and fees; and
15	WHEREAS, a property valuation administrator's office is located in every county of
16	the Commonwealth, and creating uniformity among the offices may reduce costs and
17	improve office operations; and
18	WHEREAS, studies show that achieving operational efficiency improves quality of
19	product and customer services;
20	NOW, THEREFORE,
21	Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
22	Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
23	$\Rightarrow$ Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the Property
24	Valuation Administrator's Office Task Force.
25	Section 2. The duties of the task force shall include but are not limited to:
26	(1) Studying the operations of property valuation administrators' offices to
27	identify best practices to reduce redundancy, increase efficiency, improve processes,

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increase cost savings, and create uniformity among the offices located within the
 Commonwealth;

3 (2) Studying the funding of property valuation administrators' offices to identify if 4 other funding methods or an increase in the current level of funding are needed; and

5 (3) Studying each property valuation administrator's job requirements, property 6 valuation methods, and time frame established in relation to the ad valorem taxation 7 process.

8 → Section 3. (1) The task force shall be composed of the following members,
9 with final membership of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of
10 the Legislative Research Commission:

(a) Three members of the Senate, two to be appointed by the President of theSenate and one to be appointed by the Minority Floor Leader of the Senate;

(b) Three members of the House of Representatives, two to be appointed by the
Speaker of the House and one to be appointed by the Minority Floor Leader of the House;

15 (c) The commissioner of the Kentucky Department of Revenue or a designee;

16 (d) The Kentucky Department of Revenue executive director for the Office of
17 Property Valuation or a designee; and

18 (e) Two members of the Kentucky Property Valuation Administrators19 Association submitted by its President.

20 (2) The President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House shall each appoint
21 one co-chair of the task force from among that chamber's members appointed to the task
22 force.

- Section 4. The task force shall meet at least monthly during the 2020 Interim of
  the General Assembly. The task force shall submit its findings and recommendations and
  any proposed legislation to the Legislative Research Commission for referral to the
  appropriate committee or committees by December 1, 2020.

 $\rightarrow$  Section 5. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the

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- 1 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the
- 2 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof and to
- 3 designate a study completion date.
