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1 A RESOLUTION encouraging local boards of education to solicit private support to 2 provide for bleeding control kits and training. 3 WHEREAS, when a person is losing blood, every minute counts, and the Stop the 4 Bleed campaign of the American College of Surgeons Committee on Trauma is 5 informing Americans about vital measures that can be taken to aid trauma victims; and 6 WHEREAS, the campaign is a collaboration of senior health care and public safety 7 leaders inspired by the 2012 mass shooting at Sandy Hook Elementary School to improve 8 the survival rate for victims suffering from bleeding injuries; and 9 WHEREAS, a trauma victim can die from loss of blood within five minutes, the 10 campaign teaches bleeding-control methods that have been developed by the military and 11 emergency services personnel so that citizens can function as "immediate responders" 12 while awaiting the arrival of first responders in dire situations; and 13 WHEREAS, the Stop the Bleed campaign also recommends bleeding control kits 14 containing such tools as tourniquets, dressings, and topical hemostatic agents be installed 15 in readily accessible locations in public buildings; and 16 WHEREAS, installing readily accessible bleeding control kits in public school 17 buildings and implementing quality bleeding control training can help ensure that our 18 schools are prepared to respond swiftly and safely in the event of an emergency; and 19 WHEREAS, KRS 158.4461 empowers all Kentuckians to invest in the safety of our 20 public schools through private financial and philanthropic support; and 21 WHEREAS, the provision of bleeding control kits in public school buildings and 22 quality bleeding control training for school personnel are exactly the types of school 23 safety purposes contemplated by KRS 158.4461; 24 NOW, THEREFORE, 25 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the

→ Section 1. Local boards of education are encouraged to solicit private financial

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and philanthropic support from local community members, health care providers, and
 other sources for the provision of bleeding control kits in public school buildings and
 quality bleeding control training for school personnel.

4 → Section 2. The Kentucky House of Representatives recognizes May as Stop the
5 Bleed Month.
