1	A RESOLUTION recognizing February 20, 2020, as Childhood Cancer Awareness
2	Day in the Commonwealth of Kentucky.
3	WHEREAS, one in 285 children in the United States will be diagnosed with cancer
4	by their 20th birthday; and
5	WHEREAS, 43 children per day, or 15,780 children, are diagnosed with cancer
6	annually in the United States; and
7	WHEREAS, there are approximately 40,000 children on active cancer treatment at
8	any given time; and
9	WHEREAS, 80 percent of childhood cancer patients are diagnosed late and with
10	metastatic disease; and
11	WHEREAS, on average, there has been a 0.6 percent increase in incidence per year
12	since the mid 1970s, resulting in an overall incidence increase of 24 percent over the last
13	40 years; and
14	WHEREAS, in Kentucky, through state funding researchers have discovered an 87
15	percent higher incidence of pediatric brain tumors-the leading cause of death in
16	pediatric cancer-in a 40-county area of the Commonwealth; and
17	WHEREAS, two-thirds of childhood cancer patients will have chronic health
18	conditions as a result of their treatment toxicity, and approximately one-half of childhood
19	cancer families rate the associated financial toxicity due to out-of-pocket expenses as
20	considerable to severe; and
21	WHEREAS, in the last 20 years, only four new drugs have been approved by the
22	Food and Drug Administration to specifically treat childhood cancer; and
23	WHEREAS, the National Cancer Institute recognizes the unique research needs of
24	childhood cancer and the associated need for increased funding to carry this out; and
25	WHEREAS, hundreds of nonprofit organizations at the local and national level,
26	including the American Childhood Cancer Organization, are helping children with cancer
27	and their families cope through educational, emotional, and financial support; and

- WHEREAS, researchers and healthcare professionals work diligently, dedicating
 their expertise to treat and cure children with cancer; and
- WHEREAS, too many children are affected by this deadly disease, and more must
 be done to raise awareness and find a cure;
