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1	AN ACT relating to prevention of smoking and vaping by students.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 156 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Alternative nicotine product" has the same meaning as in KRS 438.305;
7	(b) "Tobacco product" has the same meaning as in KRS 438.305; and
8	(c) "Vapor product" has the same meaning as in KRS 438.305.
9	(2) Local school districts shall provide an awareness program for faculty, staff, and
10	students to increase awareness of the dangers of vaping and the warning signs of
11	student use.
12	(3) The Department of Education shall establish, maintain, and publicize a
13	mechanism by which students may anonymously report concerns pertaining to
14	the use, distribution, or possession of any alternative nicotine product, tobacco
15	product, or vapor product on school property or during school-sponsored events.
16	(4) The anonymous reporting mechanism may consist of:
17	(a) A toll-free hotline;
18	(b) An electronic system; or
19	(c) Other mechanism which the Department of Education reasonably
20	determines will ensure anonymity for students utilizing the mechanism.
21	(5) The Department of Education shall establish policies for local school districts to
22	engage in the prompt investigation of reports made by students to the anonymous
23	reporting mechanism. The policies shall include but not be limited to:
24	(a) Identification of the timeframe and manner in which the investigations
25	must occur;
26	(b) A requirement for the prompt, written or oral notice to parents or legal
27	guardians of each student for whom there is a substantiated finding of use,

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1	distribution, or possession of an alternative nicotine product, tobacco
2	product, or vapor product, on school property or during school-sponsored
3	events; and
4	(c) A uniform process by which each student found to have used, possessed, or
5	distributed alternative nicotine products, tobacco products, or vapor
6	products on school property or during school-sponsored events will be
7	referred to smoking cessation services.
8	(6) Any child who is found to have a substantiated report of having used, possessed
9	or distributed alternative nicotine products, tobacco products, or vapor products
10	pursuant to subsection (5) of this section or who voluntarily self-identifies as
11	having done so may participate in smoking and vaping cessation services offered
12	by his or her local school district or health department at no cost.
