1 AN ACT relating to motorcycles. 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky: 3 → SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS 186.400 TO 186.640 IS CREATED 4 TO READ AS FOLLOWS: 5 The Transportation Cabinet shall establish a restriction on motorcycle operator's 6 licenses which limits the operator to the operation of a three (3) wheeled motorcycle 7 only. 8 → Section 2. KRS 186.480 is amended to read as follows: 9 (1)The Department of Kentucky State Police shall examine every applicant for an 10 operator's license as identified in KRS 186.635, except as otherwise provided in this 11 section. The examination shall be held in the county where the applicant resides 12 unless: 13 (a) The applicant is granted written permission by the *Transportation* 14 Cabinet[circuit clerk of the county in which he or she resides] to take the 15 examination in another county, and the Department of Kentucky State Police 16 agree to arrange for the examination in the other county; or 17 The applicant is tested using a bioptic telescopic device. (b) 18 (2)The examination shall include a test of the applicant's eyesight to ensure compliance 19 with the visual acuity standards set forth in KRS 186.577. The examination shall 20 also include a test of the applicant's ability to read and understand highway signs 21 regulating, warning, and directing traffic, the applicant's knowledge of traffic laws, 22 and an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to exercise ordinary and 23 reasonable control in the operation of a motor vehicle. An applicant for a 24 motorcycle operator's license shall be required to show his or her ability to operate a 25 motorcycle, in addition to other requirements of this section.] The provisions of this 26 subsection shall not apply to an applicant who: 27 At the time of application, holds a valid operator's license from another state, (a)

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1		provided that state affords a reciprocal exemption to a Kentucky resident; or
2		(b) Is a citizen of the Commonwealth who has been serving in the United States
3		military and has allowed his or her operator's license to expire.
4	(3)	In addition to the requirements of subsection (2) of this section, an applicant for
5		a motorcycle operator's license shall be required to show his or her ability to
6		operate a motorcycle. An applicant who successfully completes the skills portion
7		of the test under this subsection on a:
8		(a) Three (3) wheeled motorcycle shall be issued a motorcycle operator's license
9		restricted to the operation of three (3) wheeled motorcycles under Section 1
10		of this Act; or
11		(b) Two (2) wheeled motorcycle shall be issued a motorcycle operator's license
12		without the restriction identified in Section 1 of this Act, and may operate
13		both two (2) and three (3) wheeled motorcycles.
14	<u>(4)</u>	Any person whose intermediate license or operator's license is denied, suspended, or
15		revoked for cause shall apply for reinstatement at the termination of the period for
16		which the license was denied, suspended, or revoked by submitting to the
17		examination. The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any person whose
18		license was suspended for failure to meet the conditions described in KRS 186.411
19		when, within one (1) year of suspension, the driving privileges of such individuals
20		are reinstated.
21	<u>(5)</u> [(4)] An applicant shall not use an autocycle for <u>any</u> road skills testing
22		administered under the provisions of this section.
23		→ Section 3. KRS 15A.350 is amended to read as follows:
24	(1)	The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet shall establish a motorcycle safety education
25		program. The program shall provide for instructor training courses, instructor
26		approval, and rider training courses for novice riders that shall be held at locations
27		accessible to Kentucky residents[throughout the state]. The program may provide

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- 1 for the following:
- 2 (a) Rider training courses for *novice and* experienced riders;
- 3 (b) Activities to increase the awareness of a motorcyclist's knowledge of the
 4 effects of alcohol and drug use;
- 5 (c) Driver improvement efforts;
- 6 (d) Licensing improvement efforts;
- 7 (e) Program promotion activities;
- 8 (f) Enhancement of the public's awareness of motorcycles; and
- 9 (g) Enhancement of motorcycle safety through education.

10 The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations, (2)11 pursuant to KRS Chapter 13A, governing the development of standards for, and the 12 administration of, a motorcycle safety education program. Standards for the 13 motorcycle rider training courses shall include standards for course content, 14 delivery, curriculum, materials, student evaluation, and the training and approval of instructors. Standards shall meet or exceed established national standards for 15 16 motorcycle rider training courses prescribed by the National Highway Traffic Safety 17 Administration.

- 18 → Section 4. KRS 15A.352 is amended to read as follows:
- (1) The motorcycle safety education program shall offer motorcycle rider training
 courses designed to develop and instill the knowledge, attitudes, habits, and skills
 necessary for the proper operation of a motorcycle. The courses shall be taught by
 instructors approved under KRS 15A.354 and shall include no fewer than eight (8)
 hours of hands-on instruction for a novice course.
- 24 (2) Rider training courses shall be open to <u>*a*[any]</u> resident of <u>*any*[the]</u> state who is
 25 eligible for a motor vehicle instruction permit <u>*in the person's home state*</u>.
- 26 (3) Rider training courses shall be provided free of charge to applicants under eighteen
 27 (18) years of age.

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1 (4)The cabinet shall issue certificates of completion in a manner and form prescribed 2 by administrative regulations promulgated pursuant to KRS Chapter 13A to persons 3 who satisfactorily complete the requirements of a motorcycle rider training course 4 offered or authorized by the state program. 5 (5) The Transportation Cabinet shall exempt applicants for a motorcycle driver's license 6 or endorsement from the licensing skill test if they present satisfactory evidence of 7 successful completion of an approved rider training course that includes a similar 8 test of skill. Applicants under this subsection who successfully completed their 9 testing on a three (3) wheeled motorcycle shall be subject to the restrictions 10 outlined in subsection (3) of Section 2 of this Act. 11 (6) The Motorcycle Safety Education Commission shall publish a list of approved (a) 12 rider training courses which meet the licensing requirements. 13 (b) The Motorcycle Safety Education Commission shall publish a list of approved 14 instructor training courses which meet the licensing requirements. 15 → Section 5. KRS 15A.354 is amended to read as follows: 16 (1)The cabinet shall approve instructors for the motorcycle rider training courses. A 17 person shall not be approved as an instructor unless the person meets the 18 requirements of this section and administrative regulations of the cabinet and holds 19 a currently valid instructor certification issued by the governing body of a program 20 approved under KRS 15A.352(6)(b). 21 (2)The program shall offer instructor training courses to prepare instructors to teach 22 the motorcycle rider training courses. Successful completion of the instructor 23 training course shall require the participant to demonstrate knowledge of the course 24 material, knowledge of proper motorcycle operation, motorcycle riding proficiency, 25 and the necessary aptitude for instructing students. A person shall not be approved 26 as an instructor unless the person has successfully completed the instructor training 27 course or an equivalent course offered in another state.

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1 (3) The cabinet shall establish additional requirements for the approval of instructors, 2 including but not limited to the following: 3 The person shall have a high school diploma or its equivalent; (a) 4 (b) The person shall be at least eighteen (18) years of age and hold a valid 5 motorcycle driver's license or endorsement; The person shall have at least two (2) years of recent motorcycle riding 6 (c) 7 experience; and 8 The person's driver's license shall not have been suspended or revoked at any (d) 9 time during the preceding two (2) years or at any time within the preceding 10 five (5) years for any alcohol or drug related offense. 11 (4) In the case of a nonresident, the cabinet shall obtain and review the person's driving 12 record from the state where the person is licensed prior to approval or reapproval of 13 the person as an instructor. 14 (5) The cabinet shall <u>annually</u> review the status of all approved instructors *at least* 15 once every two (2) years and shall withdraw approval from any instructor who is no 16 longer qualified under the requirements of this section. The cabinet shall 17 immediately withdraw approval of an instructor when it receives adequate notice of 18 any disqualification.

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
