1	AN ACT relating to a sports personality's right of publicity.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	As used in sections 1 to 7 of this Act, unless the context requires otherwise:
6	(1) "Commercial purpose" means the use of an aspect of a sports personality's right
7	<u>of publicity:</u>
8	(a) On or in connection with products, merchandise, goods, services, or
9	<u>commercial activities;</u>
10	(b) For advertising or soliciting purchases of products, merchandise, goods,
11	services, or for promoting commercial activities; or
12	(c) For the purpose of fundraising;
13	(2) "Right of publicity" means a sports personality's property interest in the
14	personality's name, voice, signature, photograph, image, likeness, distinctive
15	appearance, gestures, or mannerisms; and
16	(3) "Sports personality" means a living or deceased natural person whose name,
17	voice, signature, photograph, image, likeness, distinctive appearance, gesture, or
18	mannerisms have commercial value due to the person's career as a student-
19	athlete, whether or not the person uses or authorizes the use of the person's
20	rights of publicity for a commercial purpose during the person's lifetime.
21	→SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
22	READ AS FOLLOWS:
23	(1) Sections 1 to 7 of this Act apply to an act or event that occurs within Kentucky,
24	regardless of a sports personality's domicile, residence, or citizenship.
25	(2) This chapter does not apply to:
26	(a) The use of a sports personality's name, voice, signature, photograph, image,
27	likeness, distinctive appearance, gestures, or mannerisms in material that

1	has political or newsworthy value;
2	(b) Promotional material or an advertisement for news reporting that uses all
3	or part of a past edition of the medium's own broadcast or publication and
4	does not convey or reasonably suggest that a sports personality endorses the
5	news report;
6	(c) The use of a sports personality's name to truthfully identify the sports
7	personality as the author of a written work or performer of a recorded
8	performance under circumstances in which the written work or recorded
9	performance is otherwise rightfully reproduced, exhibited, or broadcast; or
10	(d) The use of a sports personality's name, voice, signature, photograph, image,
11	likeness, distinctive appearance, gestures, or mannerisms in connection
12	with the broadcast or reporting of an event or a topic of general or public
13	<u>interest.</u>
14	→SECTION 3. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
15	READ AS FOLLOWS:
16	(1) A person may not use an aspect of a sports personality's right of publicity for a
17	commercial purpose, except as permitted in Section 7 of this Act, during the
18	sports personality's lifetime or for one hundred (100) years after the date of the
19	sports personality's death without having obtained previous written consent
20	pursuant to subsection (2) of Section 6 of this Act.
21	(2) A claim for a violation of a sports personality's right of publicity may not be
22	asserted under Sections 1 to 7 of this Act unless the alleged act or event of
23	violation occurs after the effective date of this Act.
24	→SECTION 4. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
25	READ AS FOLLOWS:
26	(1) A person who violates Section 3 of this Act may be liable for:
27	(a) Damages in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000), or actual

1	damages, including profits derived from the unauthorized use, whichever is
2	greater;
3	(b) Treble or punitive damages, as the injured party may elect, if the violation is
4	knowing, willful, or intentional; and
5	(c) Reasonable attorney's fees, costs, and expenses.
6	(2) The court may order temporary or permanent injunctive relief.
7	→SECTION 5. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
8	READ AS FOLLOWS:
9	(1) While an action filed under Section 1 to 7 of this Act is pending, a court may
10	order the impoundment of:
11	(a) Goods, merchandise, or other materials claimed to have been made or used
12	in violation of Section 3 of this Act; and
13	(b) Plates, molds, matrices, masters, tapes, negatives, or other items from which
14	goods, merchandise, or other materials may be manufactured or reproduced
15	in violation of Section 3 of this Act.
16	(2) As part of a final judgment or decree, a court may order the destruction or other
17	reasonable disposition of items described in subsection (1) of this section.
18	→SECTION 6. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
19	READ AS FOLLOWS:
20	(1) The rights recognized under Sections 1 to 7 of this Act are property rights, freely
21	transferable and descendible, in whole or in part, by contract, license, gift, trust,
22	testamentary document, or by operation of the laws of intestate succession
23	applicable to the state administering the estate and property of an intestate
24	deceased sports personality, regardless of whether the state recognizes the
25	property rights set forth under Sections 1 to 7 of this Act.
26	(2) Written consent and the rights and remedies set forth in Sections 1 to 7 of this
27	Act may be exercised and enforced by a sports personality, or by a person to

1	whom the recognized rights of a sports personality have been transferred under
2	subsection (1) of this section.

- \Rightarrow SECTION 7. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 365 IS CREATED TO
- 4 READ AS FOLLOWS:
- 5 If a deceased sports personality's recognized rights under Sections 1 to 7 of this Act
- 6 were not transferred by contract, license, gift, trust, or testamentary document, and
- 7 there are no surviving persons to whom the deceased sports personality's recognized
- 8 rights pass by intestate succession, the deceased sports personality's rights set forth in
- 9 Sections 1 to 7 of this Act terminate.
