WHEREAS, sepsis is the body's extreme reaction to infection, which can result in
life-threatening symptoms, such as multiple organ failure; and

5 WHEREAS, sepsis takes more lives than opioid overdoses, breast cancer, and 6 prostate cancer combined; and

WHEREAS, sepsis has been named as the most expansive in-patient cost in
American hospitals, with one report stating the costs were \$24 billion in 2014 at an
average of \$18,000 per hospital stay. With over 1.5 million sepsis hospital stays per year
in subsequent years, the cost has risen to well over \$27 billion per year; and

WHEREAS, on average, 30 percent of patients diagnosed with severe sepsis do not survive, with those surviving at risk of limb amputations and other permanent major organ dysfunction. Up to 50 percent of survivors suffer from post-sepsis syndrome; and

WHEREAS, post-sepsis syndrome is a major cause of morbidity, resulting in
significant disability with symptoms including lethargy, poor mobility, muscle weakness,
breathlessness, chest pain, swollen limbs, joint and muscle pain, anxiety, depression,
insomnia, and post-traumatic stress disorder; and

18 WHEREAS, annually more than 1.5 million people get sepsis in the United States;19 and

WHEREAS, sepsis is one of the most deadly conditions in the United States, with
about 250,000 fatalities annually; and

WHEREAS, the estimated annual cost of sepsis readmissions amount to more than \$3.5 billion in the United States, compared to \$7 billion for the four conditions (AMI, CHF, COPD, and pneumonia) targeted by the CMS Hospital Readmissions Reduction Program, which accounts for a significant under-recognized burden on the healthcare system;

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. The members of the Senate hereby recognize September 13, 2020, as
World Sepsis Day and the month of September as Sepsis Awareness Month, and heartily
welcome those advocates who are visiting the Capitol on this day, including Mr. Darrell
Raikes, who is a two-time sepsis survivor and a tireless voice for timely sepsis
recognition and treatment.

Section 2. The Senate recognizes and supports the Kentucky Hospital
Association in the creation of a statewide quality improvement consortium with the goal
of reducing the incidence of, and the harm from, sepsis through education and quality
improvement coaching for Kentucky hospitals and their communities.
