1	A RESOLUTION adjourning the Senate in honor and loving memory of Dr.
2	Katherine Johnson.
3	WHEREAS, Dr. Katherine Johnson was a distinguished mathematician with the
4	National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) and an integral member of the
5	nation's space program for more than three decades; and
6	WHEREAS, on November 24, 2015, Dr. Katherine Johnson received the
7	Presidential Medal of Freedom during a ceremony in the East Room of the White House
8	in Washington, D.C.; and
9	WHEREAS, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the nation's highest civilian honor,
10	recognizes individuals who have made meritorious contributions to the security or
11	national interests of the United States. Dr. Johnson was selected for her exceptional
12	leadership in the space program from Project Mercury to the modern shuttle program; and
13	WHEREAS, a native of White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, Dr. Johnson was a
14	first-generation college student whose parents rented a house near West Virginia State
15	University so she could complete her degree. Exceptionally skilled in mathematics, she
16	graduated college at the age of 18; and
17	WHEREAS, in 1952, Dr. Johnson found employment at NASA's Langley Research
18	Center at a time when African American women were typically assigned to all-black
19	computer pools; and
20	WHEREAS, within only weeks of starting, Dr. Johnson was asked to assist in the
21	Spacecraft Dynamic Branch of the Flight Dynamics and Control Division, and her
22	expertise would become crucial to every major American space program in the 20th
23	century; and
24	WHEREAS, Dr. Johnson calculated the trajectory of the first manned spaceflight by
25	an American in 1961, verified the first calculation made by a computer for the first orbit
26	of the earth by an American, and worked on Apollo 11's trajectory to the moon in 1969;
