A RESOLUTION honoring and memorializing Lieutenant John M. Spalding.

- WHEREAS, John M. Spalding was a proud son of this great Commonwealth,
 having been born in Owensboro on December 17, 1914; and
- WHEREAS, Lieutenant John M. Spalding was an instrumental figure in the Allied
 victory in World War II, and his heroism is rightfully honored by this august body on this
 day; and

WHEREAS, on June 6, 1944, D-Day, Lieutenant Spalding, disregarding his own
personal safety, led his men up Omaha Beach into the cover of a small cliff. Lieutenant
Spalding commanded his unit, which had suffered several casualties, over an
embankment and across a mine field, where they could attack critical enemy strongpoints
from a better vantage; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Spalding's men successfully destroyed those strongpoints, and he personally took down an anti-tank gun which had been firing from the beach; and WHEREAS, upon receiving the Distinguished Service Cross from the United States Army, it was noted that Lieutenant Spalding's "personal bravery and superior leadership...exemplify the highest traditions of the military forces of the United States and reflect great credit upon himself, the 1st Infantry Division, and the United States Army"; and

WHEREAS, Lieutenant Spalding was also the recipient of two Purple Hearts andvaliantly served in the Battle of the Bulge; and

WHEREAS, after his return from combat, Lieutenant Spalding served in the
Kentucky House of Representatives; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate that this body honor those military servicemen from the Commonwealth of Kentucky who went above and beyond their station and displayed uncommon courage in defense of the ideals that have shaped America and its citizens; and
