1	A RESOLUTION recognizing the bicentennial of New Haven, Kentucky.
2	WHEREAS, it is appropriate that this General Assembly honor those towns in this
3	Commonwealth who are celebrating their history and formation; and
4	WHEREAS, New Haven, being one such town, will celebrate its bicentennial on
5	February 22, 2020, and this body rightfully pauses on this day to honor New Haven's
6	citizens, its public officials, and its founders; and
7	WHEREAS, New Haven, now part of Nelson County, was first settled by Captain
8	Samuel Pottinger, who was surveying the area with James Harrod in 1754; and
9	WHEREAS, Pottinger would go on to build a stockade three miles east of present-
10	day New Haven, near the confluence of Pottinger and Knob Creeks and the Rolling Fork
11	and Salt Rivers, and this location allowed the shipment of goods to enter the Ohio River
12	near Louisville and to be transported to the critical locale of New Orleans; and
13	WHEREAS, New Haven became the center of primitive settlements that would
14	become Nelson, Marion, and Larue Counties; and
15	WHEREAS, in 1790, Samuel Pottinger built a "Big Meat Cabin" on the Rolling
16	Fork River, which allowed goods to be stored in the area until they were shipped down
17	river. This would become Pottinger's Landing; and
18	WHEREAS, it was Samuel Pottinger's son, Samuel Pottinger Jr., who first surveyed
19	the streets of New Haven, modeling the town after New Haven, Connecticut, where he
20	had just visited and had returned with a love for the town's tranquil, tree-lined streets; and
21	WHEREAS, on February 22, 1820, New Haven, Kentucky, was officially
22	designated as a town; and
23	WHEREAS, two hundred years later, New Haven and its citizens continue to thrive,
24	and on this day the General Assembly grants the town best wishes as it celebrates its
25	bicentennial, and commends all those individuals past and present who have worked so
26	hard to carry on the tradition of this shining jewel of the Commonwealth;
