1 AN ACT relating to historic properties and making an appropriation therefor.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

3 → SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 11 IS CREATED TO 4 READ AS FOLLOWS:

- 5 The Special Committee on New State Capitol Monuments shall meet at least once 6 a year at the seat of government. The committee shall at its initial meeting 7 establish criteria for the selection of statues and monuments to be located in the 8 rotunda of the New State Capitol and shall review and revise its criteria as 9 appropriate at each regularly scheduled annual meeting taking place in 10 succeeding years. The criteria shall include consideration and evaluation of 11 historical relevance and diversity with regard to any statue or monument selected 12 for display in the rotunda of the New State Capitol. The initial meeting of the committee shall take place within thirty (30) days of the appointment of the 13 members of the committee, and the annual meeting of the committee in 14 succeeding years shall take place at approximately the same time of year as the 15 16 initial meeting. At the committee's second annual meeting, it shall report to the 17 Office of the Governor, the members of the Legislative Research Commission, and the Historic Properties Advisory Commission its initial recommendations 18 19 regarding criteria for the selection of statues and monuments to be located in the 20 rotunda of the New State Capitol.
- 21 (2) The committee shall also meet upon the direction of the Historic Properties

  22 Advisory Commission when it is determined that a selection for a new statue or

  23 monument for the rotunda of the New State Capitol is appropriate. The

  24 committee shall make a recommendation for the selection of a statue or

  25 monument to the Historic Properties Advisory Commission, which shall in turn

  26 act upon the recommendation.
- → Section 2. KRS 11.026 is amended to read as follows:

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(1)

As used in this section, "state curator" means the director of the Division of Historic
Properties within the Department for Facilities and Support Services in the Finance
and Administration Cabinet with responsibilities for the preservation, restoration,
acquisition, and conservation of all decorations, objects of art, chandeliers, china,
silver, statues, paintings, furnishings, accouterments, and other aesthetic materials
that have been acquired, donated, loaned, and otherwise obtained by the
Commonwealth of Kentucky for the Executive Mansion, the Old Governor's
Mansion, the Vest Lindsey House, the New State Capitol, and other historic
properties under the control of the Finance and Administration Cabinet.

- 10 (2) The Historic Properties Advisory Commission is established to provide continuing
  11 attention to the maintenance, furnishings, and repairs of the Executive Mansion,
  12 Old Governor's Mansion, the Vest Lindsey House, and New State Capitol. The
  13 commission shall be attached to the Finance and Administration Cabinet for
  14 administrative purposes.
- 15 The commission shall consist of fourteen (14) members, one (1) of whom shall be (3) 16 the director of the Kentucky Heritage Council. It is recommended that one (1) shall 17 be the state curator, one (1) shall be the executive director of the Kentucky 18 Historical Society, one (1) shall be a resident of Franklin County with experience in 19 restoration, one (1) shall be the director of the Executive Mansion, one (1) shall be 20 the director of the Old Governor's Mansion, and the remainder of the membership 21 shall be selected from the state-at-large from persons with experience in historical 22 restoration.
  - (4) The officers of the commission shall consist of a chairman, who shall be appointed by the Governor, and a secretary, who shall be responsible for the keeping of the records and administering the directions of the commission. The state curator of the Commonwealth of Kentucky shall serve as the secretary of the commission. A member of the Governor's family may serve as an honorary, nonvoting member of

the commission. A simple majority of the membership shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business by the commission.

- (5) The public members of the commission shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve terms of four (4) years except that of the members initially appointed, two (2) members shall serve terms of one (1) year; two (2) members shall serve terms of two (2) years; one (1) member shall serve a term of three (3) years; and one (1) member shall serve a term of four (4) years. The executive director of the Historical Society and director of the Executive Mansion shall serve on the commission in an ex officio capacity. The persons holding the offices of executive director of the Historical Society, director of the Executive Mansion, director of the Kentucky Heritage Council, and state curator shall serve terms concurrent with holding their respective offices.
- (6) Each commission member shall be reimbursed for his <u>or her</u> necessary travel and other expenses actually incurred in the discharge of his <u>or her</u> duties on the commission.
- (7) There is established in the State Treasury a historic properties endowment trust fund which shall be administered by the director of the Division of Historic Properties under the supervision of the Commissioner of the Department for Facilities and Support Services. The fund may receive state appropriations, gifts, grants, and federal funds and shall be disbursed by the State Treasurer upon warrant of the secretary of finance and administration. The fund shall be used for carrying out the functions of the Division of Historic Properties. The Division of Historic Properties may publish written material pertaining to historic properties of the state and charge and collect a reasonable fee for any such publications. The proceeds shall be deposited to the credit of the fund and after paying the costs of publication, the balance of the proceeds shall be used for purposes specified in KRS 11.027.
- 27 (8) In addition to the historic properties endowment trust fund, there shall be

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established in the State Treasury a separate and distinct endowment trust fund

	known as the Ida Lee Willis-Vest Lindsey House endowment trust fund, which shall
	be jointly administered by the director of the Kentucky Heritage Council and the
	director of the Division of Historic Properties under the supervision of the
	commissioner of the Department for Facilities and Support Services. The fund may
	receive state appropriations, gifts, grants, and federal funds and shall be disbursed
	by the State Treasurer upon warrant of the secretary of finance and administration.
	The fund shall be used solely for the benefit of, or related to, the Vest Lindsey
	House, including but not limited to building maintenance and repairs, structural
	restoration or renovation, acquisition and maintenance of furnishings or
	decorations, and the development of interpretative materials regarding the historical
	and architectural significance of the Vest Lindsey House and its relation to other
	sites in the North Frankfort area. The creation of the Ida Lee Willis-Vest Lindsey
	House endowment trust fund is intended to be a supplemental source of funds and
	in no way restricts the expenditure of funds from the historic properties endowment
	trust fund or any state fund for the benefit of the Vest Lindsey House.
<u>(9)</u>	The Special Committee on New State Capitol Monuments is established and shall
	be attached to the Historic Properties Advisory Commission for administrative
	purposes. The committee shall report recommendations to the Historic Properties
	Advisory Commission regarding all statues and monuments to be located in the
	rotunda of the New State Capitol. The committee shall also inform the Office of
	the Governor and the members of the Legislative Research Commission
	regarding any recommendations it makes regarding statues and monuments to be
	included in the rotunda of the New State Capitol.
<i>(10)</i>	(a) The committee shall consist of seven (7) members, one (1) of whom shall be
	the state curator. Six (6) other committee members shall be appointed by the
	Governor, two (2) for one (1) year terms, two (2) for two (2) year terms, and

23	(12) (a) The	ere is established in the State Treasury a Special Committee on New
24	Star	te Capitol Monuments endowment trust fund which shall be
25	<u>adn</u>	ninistered by the chair of the committee in consultation with the director
26	<u>of 1</u>	the Division of Historic Properties and under the supervision of the
27	com	umissioner of the Department for Facilities and Support Services. The

fund may receive state appropriations, gifts, grants, and federal funds and shall be disbursed by the State Treasurer upon warrant of the secretary of the Finance and Administration Cabinet. The fund shall be used for carrying out the functions of the committee.

- (b) Notwithstanding KRS 45.229, any moneys remaining in the fund at the close of the fiscal year shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the succeeding fiscal year to be used for the purposes under this section. Any interest earnings of the fund shall become a part of the fund and shall not lapse. Moneys deposited in the fund are hereby appropriated for the purposes set forth in this section and shall not be appropriated or transferred by the General Assembly for any other purposes.
- → Section 3. KRS 11.027 is amended to read as follows:

- 13 (1) The commission shall meet at least every six (6) months and when called into 14 session by the chairman at the request of the Governor, of any two (2) or more 15 members of the commission, or on his own motion.
  - The commission shall examine the Executive Mansion, the Old Governor's Mansion, the Vest Lindsey House, and the New State Capitol at least once each year, and the commission shall have authority over any construction, repairs, structural restoration, or renovation of these properties. The commission shall supervise the maintenance of a current inventory of all furnishings in the properties and the inventory shall be maintained by the Division of Historic Properties in the Department for Facilities and Support Services in the Finance and Administration Cabinet. The Division of Historic Properties shall maintain inventory records relating to all such property of the state and no such property shall be disposed of except upon recommendation of the director of the Division of Historic Properties with advice of the Historic Properties Advisory Commission. The proceeds realized from the sale of any items shall be deposited in the historic properties endowment

1		fund, established by KRS 11.026, except that the proceeds realized from the sale of
2		any items derived from, or related to, the Vest Lindsey House shall be deposited in
3		the separate and distinct Ida Lee Willis-Vest Lindsey House endowment trust fund,
4		established by KRS 11.026(8).
5	(3)	The commission shall recommend, from time to time, on the needs for furnishings,
6		maintenance, repair, or renovation of the Executive Mansion, the Old Governor's
7		Mansion, the Vest Lindsey House, and the New State Capitol; and the Department
8		for Facilities and Support Services in the Finance and Administration Cabinet shall,
9		from funds available, take the action recommended. The commission shall have
10		final authority over articles placed in the properties and moneys spent on these
11		buildings, except that the Kentucky Heritage Council shall have final authority over
12		any moneys spent from the Ida Lee Willis-Vest Lindsey House endowment trust
13		fund. The commission shall develop criteria for this display of objects on and for
14		the use of the public areas of the basement and first and second floors of the New
15		State Capitol and shall be consulted by the director of the Division of Historic
16		Properties before objects are accepted for or removed from permanent display in the
17		Capitol.
18	(4)	The commission shall provide coordination and make arrangements for an orderly
19		transition between outgoing and incoming chief executives.
20	<u>(5)</u>	The commission shall direct the Special Committee on New State Capitol
21		Monuments to meet when it determines that a selection for a new statue or
22		monument for the rotunda of the New State Capitol is appropriate.
23	<u>(6)</u>	The commission shall act upon any recommendation made by the committee with
24		regard to the selection for a new statue or monument for the rotunda of the New
25		State Capitol by approving the recommendation or requesting that the committee
26		make another recommendation.
