1	AN ACT relating to damages to small businesses resulting from executive orders.
2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 39A IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Emergency order" means:
7	1. Any state of emergency declared under this chapter;
8	2. Any executive powers exercised under KRS 39A.100, 194A.025,
9	214.020, 241.090, or 244.120; or
10	3. Any executive powers exercised under a similar statute or provision
11	issued in response to an public emergency, disease outbreak, public
12	health threat, or similar occurrence, which has the effect of shutting
13	down business, seizing property, or otherwise infringing on any rights
14	guaranteed by the United States Constitution or Kentucky
15	Constitution, or any other statute; and
16	(b) "Small business" means a business entity organized for profit, including a
17	sole proprietorship, partnership, limited partnership, corporation, limited
18	liability company, joint venture, association, or cooperative that has fifty
19	(50) or fewer full time employees or has gross annual sales of less than one
20	million dollars (\$1,000.000).
21	(2) Any owner of a small business adversely effected by an emergency order may
22	bring an action for damages against the Commonwealth in the Circuit Court in
23	the county in which the person resides or in which the person's affected business
24	<u>is located.</u>
25	(3) An owner of a small business may seek damages under subsection (2) of this
26	section for:
2.7	(a) Lost income during and for a reasonable period of time after, a temporary

1		partial or complete closure of the business that would not have occurred but
2		for compliance with the emergency order;
3		(b) Loss of going concern, including loss of real property, if the closure of the
4		business results in the owner going out of business and the owner would not
5		have gone out of business but for compliance with the emergency order;
6		<u>and</u>
7		(c) Fees and costs incurred in bringing the action.
8	<u>(4)</u>	The owner of the small business has the burden of proving that the loss is due to
9		the emergency order.
10	<u>(5)</u>	An action under this section shall be commenced within one (1) year of the
11		expiration of the emergency order that resulted in the closure.
