2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 42 IS CREATED TO

5	(1) As used in this section:
6	(a) "Personal protective equipment" means:
7	1. Protective equipment for eyes, face, head, and extremities;
8	2. Protective clothing;
9	3. Respiratory devices; and
10	4. Protective shields and barriers;
11	necessary to be worn by reason of hazards of processes or environment,
12	chemical hazards, radiological hazards, or mechanical irritants
13	encountered in a manner capable of causing illness of a person through
14	absorption, inhalation, or physical contact;
15	(b) "Public agency" means the Commonwealth of Kentucky, its departments,
16	agencies, boards, commissions, and institutions, and all political
17	subdivisions, including school districts; and
18	(c) "United States" means the United States of America, the District of
19	Columbia, and all territories and possessions subject to the jurisdiction of
20	the United States of America.
21	(2) Each contract for the purchase or lease of personal protective equipment by any
22	public agency shall contain a provision that any manufactured goods or
23	commodities used or supplied in the performance of that contract or any
24	subcontract thereto shall be manufactured or produced in Kentucky, or if
25	unavailable from such manufacturer in Kentucky, in the United States.
26	(3) The requirements of subsection (2) of this section shall not apply if the executive
27	head of the public agency certifies in writing to the Finance and Administration

1		Cabinet and the Attorney General that the specified products:
2		(a) Are not manufactured or produced in Kentucky in sufficient quantities to
3		meet the requirements of the public agency and must be obtained from
4		elsewhere in the United States;
5		(b) Are not manufactured or produced in either Kentucky or the United States
6		in sufficient quantities to meet the requirements of the public agency, if
7		applicable;
8		(c) Cannot be manufactured or produced in Kentucky within the necessary
9		time in sufficient quantities to meet the requirements of the public agency
10		and must be obtained from elsewhere in the United States;
11		(d) Cannot be manufactured or produced in either Kentucky or the United
12		States within the necessary time in sufficient quantities to meet the
13		requirements of the public agency, if applicable; or
14		(e) Are unavailable in Kentucky or, if applicable, in the United States.
15	<u>(4)</u>	The certification provided under subsection (3) of this section shall specify the
16		nature of the contract, the product being purchased or leased, the names and
17		addresses of the Kentucky manufacturers and producers contacted by the public
18		agency, or, if applicable, any manufacturers and producers in the United States
19		contacted by the public agency and an indication that those manufacturers or
20		producers could not supply sufficient quantities.
21	<u>(5)</u>	The Finance and Administration Cabinet shall alert the Attorney General of any
22		violations of this section.
23	<u>(6)</u>	Notwithstanding any provision to the contrary, this section shall not apply to
24		health care providers licensed in Kentucky or companies that purchase personal
25		protective equipment on behalf of, or to support, such health care providers.
26		Health care providers subject to this exemption shall be broadly construed to
27		include but not be limited to public and private providers licensed or certified as
