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AN ACT relating to claims against an estate.

## 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

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→ Section 1. KRS 396.011 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) All claims against a decedent's estate which arose before the death of the decedent,
5 excluding claims of the United States, the State of Kentucky and any subdivision
6 thereof, whether due or to become due, absolute or contingent, liquidated or
7 unliquidated, founded on contract, tort, or other legal basis, if not barred earlier by
8 other statute of limitations[ or non claim statutes], are barred against the estate, the
9 personal representative, and the heirs and devisees[ and non probate transferees of
10 the decedent], unless presented within <u>six (6) months after the appointment of the</u>

11 *personal representative, or where no personal representative has been appointed,* 

- 12 *within two (2) years after the decedent's death*[the earlier of the following:
- 13 (a) Eight (8) months after the decedent's death;
- 14 (b) The time period provided in KRS 396.012(2) for creditors who are given
   15 actual notice; or
- 16 (c) The time period provided in KRS 396.012(1) for creditors who are barred by
   17 publication].
- 18 (2) Nothing in this section shall affect or prevent:
- (a) To the extent of the security only, any proceeding to enforce any mortgage,
  pledge, lien or other security interest securing an obligation of the decedent or
  upon property of the estate; or
- (b) To the limits of the insurance protection only, any proceeding to establish
  liability of the decedent or the personal representative for which he is
  protected by liability insurance.
