1 If the commission determines in the preliminary investigation that the facts are not (3)2 sufficient to constitute a violation of this chapter, the commission shall immediately 3 terminate the investigation and notify in writing the complainant, if any, and the 4 person alleged to have committed a violation. The commission may confidentially 5 inform the alleged violator of potential violations and provide information to ensure 6 future compliance with the law. If the alleged violator publicly discloses the 7 existence of such action by the commission, the commission may confirm the 8 existence of the resolution and, in its discretion, make public any documents which 9 were issued to the alleged violator.

10 (4) If the commission, during the course of the preliminary investigation, finds probable
11 cause to believe that a violation of this chapter has occurred, the commission may,
12 upon majority vote:

- 13 Due to mitigating circumstances such as lack of significant economic (a) 14 advantage or gain by the alleged violator, lack of significant economic loss to 15 the state, or lack of significant impact on public confidence in government, in 16 writing, confidentially reprimand the alleged violator for potential violations 17 of the law and provide a copy of the reprimand to the alleged violator's appointing authority, if any. If the alleged violator publicly discloses the 18 19 existence of such an action, the commission may confirm the existence of the 20 action and, in its discretion, make public any documents which were issued to 21 the alleged violator; or

(b) Initiate an administrative proceeding to determine whether there has been a violation.

- (5) If the commission determines that a violation of this chapter has occurred in a case
 involving a contract with state government, the secretary of the Finance and
 Administration Cabinet may void any contract related to that case.
