1	A JOINT RESOLUTION directing the Cabinet for Health and Family Services to
2	study alternatives to institutionalized care for individuals with intellectual or
3	developmental disabilities and complex medical needs.
4	WHEREAS, the 1999 U.S. Supreme Court decision in Olmstead v. L.C. held that
5	individuals with disabilities have the qualified right to receive state-funded supports and
6	services in the community rather than in institutions; and
7	WHEREAS, intermediate care facilities provide comprehensive and individualized
8	healthcare, training, and rehabilitation services to individuals to promote their function
9	skills and independence; and
10	WHEREAS, in 2019, 436 individuals living with disabilities resided in intermediate
11	care facilities across the state; and
12	WHEREAS, in Kentucky the aggregate cost per capita, per month of providing
13	services in an institution during a 12-month period is \$29,309 and \$6,785 per capita, per
14	month of providing support though the Supports for Community Living Wavier,
15	including exceptional supports, during a 12-month period; and
16	WHEREAS, in 2019, for the 436 individuals residing in intermediate care facilities
17	the total cost was \$141,564,563 and for 4,825 individuals with a Support for Community
18	Living waiver the total cost was \$382,289,054; and
19	WHEREAS, Kentucky currently participates in a Money Follows the Person
20	demonstration grant program funded by the federal Centers for Medicare and Medicaid
21	Services for the purpose of transitioning individuals out of institutions and into less-
22	restrictive settings; and
23	WHEREAS, developing a high-intensity group home pilot program would provide
24	community access versus isolation, access to integrated healthcare, individualized,
25	person-centered behavior support plans, and community socialization and integration for
26	those residing in them;
27	NOW, THEREFORE,

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Be it resolved by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

Section 1. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services is hereby directed to study alternatives to institutionalized care for individuals with intellectual or developmental disabilities and complex medical needs and to explore strategies for reducing the number of Kentuckians currently residing in intermediate care facilities. This study shall include an assessment of the feasibility of developing and operating a multi-year high-intensity group home pilot program for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities and complex medical needs that would serve at least 12 individuals in four- or six-person group homes with at least a one-to-one staff to resident ratio. The cabinet shall collaborate with stakeholders representing private providers, community mental health centers, and consumers and their families.

→ Section 2. The Cabinet for Health and Family Services shall submit its findings regarding alternatives to institutionalized care, strategies for reducing the number of Kentuckians currently residing in intermediate care facilities, and the feasibility of a high-intensity group home pilot program to the Legislative Research Commission, the Interim Joint Committee on Health, Welfare, and Family Services, and the Medicaid Oversight and Advisory Committee no later than November 1, 2021.
