4	(1)	No person engaged in sales at retail shall display hypodermic syringes or needles in
5		any portion of the place of business which is open or accessible to the public.
6	(2)	Unless being dispensed for use in conjunction with a prescription drug requiring
7		needles for reconstitution or administration, every person engaged in sales of
8		hypodermic syringes or needles without a hypodermic syringe or needle
9		prescription shall limit the sale to thirty (30) hypodermic syringes or needles per
10		person[at retail shall maintain a bound record in which shall be kept:
11		(a) The name of the purchaser; and
12		(b) The address of the purchaser; and
13		(c) The quantity of syringes or needles purchased; and
14		(d) The date of the sale; and
15		(e) Planned use of such syringes or needles].
16	(3)	Hypodermic syringes or needles may be sold without a prescription to individuals
17		sixteen (16) years of age and older with valid identification providing proof of
18		age.
19	<u>(4)</u>	Each hypodermic syringe or needle sale shall be accompanied by:
20		(a) Physical or electronic information on safe and proper hypodermic syringe
21		and needle disposal;
22		(b) Physical or electronic educational and referral information for substance
23		use disorder and treatment;
24		(c) A verbal, physical, or electronic offer to provide a naloxone prescription for
25		opioid overdose; and
26		(d) A verbal, physical, or electronic offer to provide the purchaser's name and
27		contact information to a local public health substance use disorder outreach

2	<u>(5)</u>	Any person authorized to sell hypodermic needles or syringes, licensed medical
3		professional, hospital, or medical clinic that disposes of used hypodermic syringes
4		or needles shall render the hypodermic syringes or needles incapable of further
5		use and ensure proper disposal.
6	<u>(6)</u>	Compliance with the requirements for the sale of hypodermic needles or syringes
7		in this section shall be enforced by the seller and may be inspected during
8		business hours by any law enforcement officer or an agent or employee of the
9		Cabinet for Health and Family Services or the Board of Pharmacy who is
10		engaged in the enforcement of provisions of KRS Chapter 218A related to
11		prescriptions for and use of controlled substances [Said record shall be maintained
12		for a period of two (2) years from the date of the sale and shall be available for
13		inspection during business hours by any law enforcement officer, agent or employee

16	(4)	No person shall present false identification or give a false or fictitious name or

20		(b) Fraudulently alter any record required to be kept by this section; or
21		(c) Destroy, before the time period required by this section has elapsed, any
22		record required to be kept by this section; or
23		(d) Sell, or otherwise dispose of, any hypodermic syringe to any person who does
24		not present the identification required by this section; or
25		(e) Disclose the names in said book except to those required by this section.
26	(6)	Any physician, other licensed medical person, hospital, or clinic disposing of
27		hypodermic syringes or needles shall crush the barrel of same or otherwise render
