19	completed by a PCA who is in good standing with his or her employer after the
20	COVID-19 state of emergency is rescinded by the Governor. The PCA shall be
21	deemed a state registered nurse aide and shall be placed on the Kentucky Nurse
22	<u>Aide Registry if:</u>
23	(a) A minimum of eighty (80) hours of PCA duties have been completed within
24	a skilled nursing facility under the supervision of a licensed or registered
25	nurse; and
26	(b) Competency has been established by the following:
27	1. Through an assessment in all areas of required nurse aide training as
