- 1 AN ACT proposing to amend Sections 36 and 42 of the Constitution of Kentucky 2 relating to sessions of the General Assembly.
- 3 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 4 → Section 1. It is proposed that Section 36 of the Constitution of Kentucky be 5 amended to read as follows:

6 The General Assembly, in odd-numbered years, shall meet in regular session (1)7 for a period not to exceed a total of thirty (30) legislative days, except as otherwise 8 provided in this Constitution, divided as follows: The General Assembly shall convene 9 for the first part of the session on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January in 10 odd-numbered years for the purposes of electing legislative leaders, adopting rules of procedure, organizing committees, and introducing and considering legislation. The 11 12 General Assembly shall then adjourn. The General Assembly shall convene for the 13 second part of the session on the first Tuesday in February of that year. Any legislation 14 introduced but not enacted in the first part of the session shall be carried over into the 15 second part of the session. In any part of the session in an odd-numbered year, no bill 16 raising revenue or appropriating funds shall become a law unless it shall be agreed to by 17 three-fifths of all the members elected to each House.

18 The General Assembly shall then adjourn until the first Tuesday after the first (2)19 Monday in January of the following even-numbered years, at which time the General 20 Assembly shall convene in regular session.

(3) All sessions shall be held at the seat of government, except in case of war, 22 insurrection or pestilence, when it may, by proclamation of the Governor, assemble, for 23 the time being, elsewhere.

24 \rightarrow Section 2. It is proposed that Section 42 of the Constitution of Kentucky be 25 amended to read as follows:

26 (1) (a) The members of the General Assembly shall severally receive from the 27 State Treasury compensation for their services: Provided, No change to the compensation

of the members of the General Assembly shall take effect during the session at which it
 is made.

3 (b) No[; nor shall a] session occurring in odd-numbered years shall continue 4 beyond thirty legislative days extend beyond March 30; nor shall a session of the 5 General Assembly occurring in even-numbered years continue beyond sixty legislative 6 days, except that a session in any year may, by a vote of three-fifths of the members 7 elected to each House, be extended by no more than ten legislative days, with no 8 legislative session under this section of the Constitution to extend beyond December 9 31. [nor shall it extend beyond April 15;] These limitations as to length of sessions shall 10 not apply to any extraordinary session under Section 80 of this Constitution or to the 11 Senate when sitting as a court of impeachment. A legislative day shall be construed to 12 mean a calendar day, exclusive of Sundays, legal holidays, or any day on which neither 13 House meets.

Section 3. This amendment shall be submitted to the voters of the
Commonwealth for their ratification or rejection at the time and in the manner provided
for under Sections 256 and 257 of the Constitution and under KRS 118.415. The
following shall be printed on the ballot:

18 "Are you in favor of amending Sections 36 and 42 of the Constitution of Kentucky 19 to eliminate the existing dates by which the General Assembly must complete the allotted 20 number of legislative days for the session, with no session to extend beyond December 21 31, and, if three-fifths of the members elected to each House agree, to allow the General 22 Assembly to extend a regular legislative session by no more than ten legislative days?

23 Section 36

(1) The General Assembly, in odd-numbered years, shall meet in regular session for a
period not to exceed a total of thirty (30) legislative days, *except as otherwise provided in this Constitution*, divided as follows: The General Assembly shall convene for the first
part of the session on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in January in odd-numbered

1 years for the purposes of electing legislative leaders, adopting rules of procedure, 2 organizing committees, and introducing and considering legislation. The General 3 Assembly shall then adjourn. The General Assembly shall convene for the second part of 4 the session on the first Tuesday in February of that year. Any legislation introduced but 5 not enacted in the first part of the session shall be carried over into the second part of the 6 session. In any part of the session in an odd-numbered year, no bill raising revenue or 7 appropriating funds shall become a law unless it shall be agreed to by three-fifths of all 8 the members elected to each House.

9 (2) The General Assembly shall then adjourn until the first Tuesday after the first 10 Monday in January of the following even-numbered years, at which time the General 11 Assembly shall convene in regular session.

(3) All sessions shall be held at the seat of government, except in case of war,
insurrection or pestilence, when it may, by proclamation of the Governor, assemble, for
the time being, elsewhere.

15 <u>Section 42</u>

(1) (a) The members of the General Assembly shall severally receive from the
 State Treasury compensation for their services: Provided, No change <u>to the compensation</u>
 of the members of the General Assembly shall take effect during the session at which it
 is made.

20 (b) No_[: nor shall a] session occurring in odd-numbered years shall continue 21 beyond thirty legislative days extend beyond March 30; nor shall a session of the 22 General Assembly occurring in even-numbered years continue beyond sixty legislative days, except that a session in any year may, by a vote of three-fifths of the members 23 24 elected to each House, be extended by no more than ten legislative days, with no 25 legislative session under this section of the Constitution to extend beyond December 26 31. [nor shall it extend beyond April 15;] These limitations as to length of sessions shall 27 not apply to any extraordinary session under Section 80 of this Constitution or to the
