

1 AN ACT relating to identity documents.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 186.412 is amended to read as follows:

- 4 (1) As used in this section, "applicant" means a person who is a citizen or permanent  
5 resident of the United States.
- 6 (2) An applicant shall apply for an instruction permit or operator's license with the  
7 Transportation Cabinet, or through alternative technology. Except as provided in  
8 KRS 186.417, the application form shall require the applicant's:
- 9 (a) Full legal name and signature;
  - 10 (b) Date of birth;
  - 11 (c) Social Security number or a letter from the Social Security Administration  
12 declining to issue a Social Security number;
  - 13 (d) Sex;
  - 14 (e) Present Kentucky resident address, exclusive of a post office box address  
15 alone, *or a completed form attesting to the lack of a fixed, permanent*  
16 *address as established in accordance with subsection (3) of this section;*
  - 17 (f) Other information necessary to permit the application of United States citizens  
18 to also serve as an application for voter registration;
  - 19 (g) A brief physical description of the applicant;
  - 20 (h) Proof of the applicant's Kentucky residency, including but not limited to a  
21 deed or property tax bill, utility agreement or utility bill, ~~[-or-]~~ rental housing  
22 agreement, *or completed form attesting to the lack of a fixed, permanent*  
23 *address as established in accordance with subsection (3) of this section;* and
  - 24 (i) Other information the cabinet may require by administrative regulation  
25 promulgated under KRS Chapter 13A.
- 26 (3) *The cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations in accordance with KRS*  
27 *Chapter13A to develop forms and procedures whereby an applicant under this*

1 section, KRS 186.4121, or Sections 2 or 3 of this Act who does not have a fixed,  
 2 permanent address may use as proof of residency, a form, attested to by a  
 3 homeless shelter, health care facility, or social service agency currently providing  
 4 the applicant treatment or services, that the applicant is a resident of Kentucky.  
 5 An applicant who does not have a fixed, permanent address shall not be issued a  
 6 voluntary travel ID operator's license under this section or KRS 186.4121.

7 **(4)** In addition to the information identified in subsection (2) of this section, a  
 8 permanent resident shall present one (1) of the following documents issued by the  
 9 United States Department of Homeland Security, United States Bureau of  
 10 Citizenship and Immigration Services:

- 11 (a) An I-551 card with a photograph of the applicant; or  
 12 (b) A form with the photograph of the applicant or a passport with a photograph  
 13 of the applicant on which the United States Department of Homeland  
 14 Security, United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services, has  
 15 stamped the following: "Processed for I-551. Temporary evidence of lawful  
 16 admission for permanent residence. Valid until .... (Expiration Date).  
 17 Employment authorized."

18 ~~(5)~~~~(4)~~ Upon application for an operator's license under this section, the cabinet shall  
 19 capture a photograph of the applicant in accordance with the requirements of KRS  
 20 186.4102(1).

21 ~~(6)~~~~(5)~~ (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the cabinet shall  
 22 electronically scan the documents required for application under this section  
 23 and shall electronically retain the application, supporting documents, and the  
 24 photograph of the applicant. Upon completion of any required examinations  
 25 under KRS 186.480, the cabinet shall present the applicant with a temporary  
 26 operator's license or instruction permit, which shall be valid for thirty (30)  
 27 days until a permanent operator's license or instruction permit is mailed to the

1 applicant by the Transportation Cabinet.

2 (b) The cabinet shall only electronically scan the birth certificate of an individual  
3 applying for a voluntary travel ID instruction permit or operator's license. If  
4 the applicant is not seeking such a permit or license, the cabinet shall not  
5 electronically scan the applicant's birth certificate.

6 (c) An applicant for an operator's license or instruction permit shall not be  
7 required to surrender the applicant's birth certificate for image capture, image  
8 storage, or image transmission to any entity, including the federal government,  
9 unless express consent is given by the applicant during the course of obtaining  
10 a voluntary travel ID license or permit.

11 ~~(Z)(6)~~ An applicant shall swear an oath to the cabinet as to the truthfulness of the  
12 statements contained in the form.

13 ➔Section 2. KRS 186.4122 is amended to read as follows:

14 (1) As used in this section, "applicant" means a person who is a citizen or permanent  
15 resident of the United States.

16 (2) The Transportation Cabinet shall issue a personal identification card to an applicant  
17 who:

18 (a) Is a Kentucky resident;

19 (b) Applies in person to the cabinet or through alternative technology; and

20 (c) Complies with the provisions of this section.

21 (3) Upon application for a personal identification card under this section, the cabinet  
22 shall capture a photograph of the applicant in accordance with KRS 186.4102(1).

23 (4) (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, the cabinet shall  
24 electronically scan the documents required for application under this section  
25 and shall electronically retain the application, supporting documents, and the  
26 photograph of the applicant. The cabinet shall present the applicant with a  
27 temporary personal identification card, which shall be valid for thirty (30)

1 days until a permanent personal identification card is mailed to the applicant  
2 by the Transportation Cabinet.

3 (b) The cabinet shall only electronically scan the birth certificate of an individual  
4 applying for a voluntary travel ID personal identification card. If the applicant  
5 is not seeking such a document, the cabinet shall not electronically scan the  
6 applicant's birth certificate.

7 (c) An applicant for a personal identification card shall not be required to  
8 surrender the applicant's birth certificate for image capture, image storage, or  
9 image transmission to any entity, including the federal government, unless  
10 express consent is given by the applicant during the course of obtaining a  
11 voluntary travel ID personal identification card.

12 (5) (a) An application for a personal identification card shall be accompanied by the  
13 same information as is required for an operator's license under KRS 186.412~~],~~  
14 ~~except if an applicant does not have a fixed, permanent address, the applicant~~  
15 ~~may use as proof of residency a signed letter from a homeless shelter, health~~  
16 ~~care facility, or social service agency currently providing the applicant~~  
17 ~~treatment or services and attesting that the applicant is a resident of~~  
18 ~~Kentucky].~~ An applicant who does not have a fixed, permanent address shall  
19 not be issued a voluntary travel ID personal identification card.

20 (b) It shall be permissible for the application form for a personal identification  
21 card to include as an applicant's most current resident address a mailing  
22 address or an address provided on a voter registration card.

23 (c) If the applicant is not the legal owner or possessor of the address provided on  
24 the application form, the applicant shall swear that he or she has permission  
25 from the legal owner, authorized agent for the legal owner, or possessor to use  
26 the address for purposes of obtaining the personal identification card.

27 (6) (a) Every applicant for a personal identification card under this section shall

1 swear an oath to the cabinet as to the truthfulness of the statements contained  
2 on the application form.

3 (b) A personal identification card may be suspended or revoked if the person who  
4 was issued the card presents false or misleading information to the cabinet  
5 when applying for the card.

6 (7) A personal identification card issued under this section shall be valid for a period of  
7 eight (8) years from the date of issuance, except that if the personal identification  
8 card is issued to a person who does not have a fixed, permanent address, then the  
9 personal identification card shall be valid for three (3) years~~one (1) year~~ from the  
10 date of issuance.

11 (8) (a) An applicant may be issued a personal identification card if the applicant  
12 currently holds a valid Kentucky instruction permit or operator's license,  
13 except that a person shall not hold more than one (1) license or personal  
14 identification card that is a voluntary travel ID identity document which  
15 indicates that it meets the requirements for federal identification under Pub. L.  
16 No. 109-13, Title II, as referenced in KRS 186.4102(8).

17 (b) If a person's instruction permit or operator's license has expired, or has been  
18 suspended or revoked, the person may be issued a personal identification card.  
19 Subject to the limitations in paragraph (a) of this subsection, a personal  
20 identification card may be surrendered when the person applies to have his or  
21 her instruction permit or operator's license reinstated.

22 ➔Section 3. KRS 186.4123 is amended to read as follows:

23 (1) As used in this section, "applicant" means a person who is not a United States  
24 citizen and has not been granted status as a permanent resident of the United States.

25 (2) The Transportation Cabinet shall issue a personal identification card to an applicant  
26 who:

27 (a) Is a Kentucky resident;

- 1 (b) Applies in person to either the Transportation Cabinet in Frankfort or a  
2 Transportation Cabinet field office; and
- 3 (c) Complies with the provisions of this section.
- 4 (3) Upon application for a personal identification card under this section, the cabinet  
5 shall capture a photograph of the applicant in accordance with KRS 186.4102(1).
- 6 (4) The cabinet shall electronically scan the documents required for application under  
7 this section, supporting documents, and the photograph of the applicant into the  
8 cabinet's database.
- 9 (5) (a) An application for a personal identification card shall be accompanied by the  
10 same information as is required for an operator's license under KRS 186.412~~},~~  
11 ~~along with other documents required under this section, except if an applicant~~  
12 ~~does not have a fixed, permanent address, the applicant may use as proof of~~  
13 ~~residency a signed letter from a homeless shelter, health care facility, or social~~  
14 ~~service agency currently providing the applicant treatment or services and~~  
15 ~~attesting that the applicant is a resident of Kentucky}~~. An applicant who does  
16 not have a fixed, permanent address shall not be issued a voluntary travel ID  
17 personal identification card.
- 18 (b) It shall be permissible for the application form for a personal identification  
19 card to include as an applicant's most current resident address a mailing  
20 address or an address provided on a voter registration card.
- 21 (c) If the applicant is not the legal owner or possessor of the address provided on  
22 the application form, the applicant shall swear that he or she has permission  
23 from the legal owner, authorized agent for the legal owner, or possessor to use  
24 the address for purposes of obtaining the personal identification card.
- 25 (6) The application form under this section shall be accompanied by the applicant's  
26 documentation issued by the United States Department of Homeland Security,  
27 United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services, authorizing the

1 applicant to be in the United States. The Transportation Cabinet shall verify the  
2 information submitted under this subsection through the Systematic Alien  
3 Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) program.

4 (7) The application form of a special status individual with a K-1 status shall be  
5 accompanied by an original or certified copy of the applicant's completed marriage  
6 license signed by the official who presided over the marriage ceremony and two (2)  
7 witnesses. The application form of a special status individual with a K-1 status shall  
8 also include the applicant's petition to enter the United States for the purpose of  
9 marriage that contains the name of the prospective spouse. If the name of the  
10 prospective spouse on the petition does not match the name of the spouse on the  
11 marriage license, the Transportation Cabinet shall not be required to issue an  
12 operator's license.

13 (8) (a) The Transportation Cabinet shall verify and validate the immigration status  
14 and personal identity of an applicant under this section through federal  
15 government systems and databases.

16 (b) If an applicant's identity and immigration status is validated, the cabinet shall  
17 capture a photograph of the applicant, and scan the required documents into  
18 the cabinet's database, and shall present the applicant with a temporary  
19 personal identification card, which shall be valid for thirty (30) days until a  
20 permanent personal identification card is mailed to the applicant.

21 (c) An applicant under this section shall only be issued a standard personal  
22 identification card.

23 (9) (a) An applicant shall apply to renew a personal identification card, or obtain a  
24 duplicate personal identification card, at the Transportation Cabinet in  
25 Frankfort or a Transportation Cabinet field office.

26 (b) If a person has any type of change in his or her immigration status, the person  
27 shall apply to update with either the Transportation Cabinet in Frankfort or a

1           Transportation Cabinet field office within ten (10) days.

2   (10) (a) Every applicant for a personal identification card under this section shall  
3           swear an oath to the Transportation Cabinet as to the truthfulness of the  
4           statements contained on the application form.

5   (b) A personal identification card may be suspended or revoked if the person who  
6           was issued the card presents false or misleading information to the cabinet  
7           when applying for the card.

8   (11) (a) Except as provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, an initial or renewal  
9           personal identification card issued to an applicant who is not a special status  
10          individual shall be valid for a period equal to the length of time the applicant's  
11          documentation from the United States Department of Homeland Security,  
12          United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services, is valid, or  
13          eight (8) years, whichever time period is shorter.

14   (b) An initial or renewal personal identification card shall be valid for a period of  
15          one (1) year if:

16          1. The applicant is not a special status individual and the applicant's  
17             documentation issued by the United States Department of Homeland  
18             Security, United States Bureau of Citizenship and Immigration Services,  
19             is issued for an indefinite period of time and does not have an expiration  
20             date. The fee shall be the same as for a regular personal identification  
21             card; or

22          2. The personal identification card is issued to a person who does not have  
23             a fixed, permanent address.

24   ➔Section 4. KRS 186.531 is amended to read as follows:

25   (1) As used in this section:

26   (a) "AOC Fund" means the circuit court clerk salary account created in KRS  
27          27A.052;



- 1 (b) "GF" means the general fund;
- 2 (c) "IP" means instruction permit;
- 3 (d) "License Fund" or "LF" means the KYTC photo license account created in
- 4 KRS 174.056;
- 5 (e) "MC" means motorcycle;
- 6 (f) "MC Fund" or "MCF" means the motorcycle safety education program fund
- 7 established in KRS 15A.358;
- 8 (g) "OL" means operator's license; and
- 9 (h) "PIDC" means personal identification card.

7 under KRS 186.410 and 186.4122 shall be distributed in the same manner as a  
8 document applied for in person with the cabinet.

9 ~~(6)~~~~[(7)]~~ (a) An applicant for an original or renewal operator's license, permit,  
10 commercial driver's license, motorcycle operator's license, or personal  
11 identification card shall be requested by the cabinet to make a donation to  
12 promote an organ donor program.

13 (b) The donation under this subsection shall be added to the regular fee for an  
14 original or renewal motor vehicle operator's license, permit, commercial  
15 driver's license, motorcycle operator's license, or personal identification card.  
16 One (1) donation may be made per issuance or renewal of a license or any  
17 combination thereof.

18 (c) The fee shall be paid to the cabinet and shall be forwarded by the cabinet on a  
19 monthly basis to the Kentucky Circuit Court Clerks' Trust for Life, and such  
20 moneys are hereby appropriated to be used exclusively for the purpose of  
21 promoting an organ donor program. A donation under this subsection shall be  
22 voluntary and may be refused by the applicant at the time of issuance or  
23 renewal.

25 application for an initial or renewal operator's license, instruction permit, or  
26 personal identification card, shall pay an additional application fee of thirty dollars  
27 (\$30), which shall be deposited in the photo license account:

1 (a) An applicant who is not a United States citizen or permanent resident and who  
2 applies under KRS 186.4121 or 186.4123; or

3 (b) An applicant who is applying for a instruction permit, operator's license, or  
4 personal identification card without a photo under KRS 186.4102(9).

5 ~~(8)~~~~(9)~~ (a) Except for individuals exempted under paragraph (c) of this subsection,  
6 an applicant for relicensing after revocation or suspension shall pay a  
7 reinstatement fee of forty dollars (\$40).

8 (b) The reinstatement fee under this subsection shall be distributed by the State  
9 Treasurer as follows:

10 1. Thirty-five dollars (\$35) shall be deposited into the photo license  
11 account; and

12 2. Five dollars (\$5) shall be deposited into a trust and agency fund to be

22 the cabinet:

23 (a) Shall accept cash and personal checks;~~and~~

24 (b) May accept other methods of payment in accordance with KRS 45.345;

25 (c) *May enter into billing agreements with homeless shelters, health care*  
26 *facilities, or social service agencies that serve individuals without a fixed,*  
27 *permanent address.*

- 1 (10)~~(11)~~ There shall be no fee assessed for the initial, renewal, or duplicate standard  
2 personal identification card to an individual, if the individual:
- 3 (a) Does not possess a valid operator's license or a commercial driver's license;
  - 4 and
  - 5 (b) Is at least eighteen (18) years of age on or before the next regular election.
