2	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 11 IS CREATED TO
4	READ AS FOLLOWS:
5	(1) No executive order shall substantially burden the right of a person to:
6	(a) Engage or not engage in an act that would violate their sincerely held
7	<u>religious beliefs;</u>
8	(b) Bear arms, which includes the sale and manufacture of arms and
9	ammunition;
10	(c) Protect themselves, others, or their property with justifiable force, as defined
11	in KRS Chapter 503;
12	(d) Own or operate a business; or
13	(e) Collect, generate, manufacture, extract, or distribute materials or natural
14	resources serving as a source of energy to heat, cool, or provide electricity to
15	homes or businesses, or provide fuel for vehicles.
16	(2) A substantial burden may also include excessive taxes or fees, if the excessive
17	taxes or fees would limit the ability of a person to freely engage in the rights listed
18	in subsection (1) of this section.
19	(3) In addition to the limitations provided in subsection (1) of this section, an
20	executive order shall not violate the Constitution of the United States, the
21	Kentucky Constitution, any law of the Commonwealth, any federal law, or any
22	local ordinance.
23	→SECTION 2. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 13A IS CREATED TO
24	READ AS FOLLOWS:
25	(1) No administrative regulation shall substantially burden the right of a person to:
26	(a) Engage or not engage in an act that would violate their sincerely held
