5	<u>(1)</u>	As used in this section, "PFAS chemicals" means all perfluoroalkyl or
6		polyfluoroalkyl substances containing at least one (1) fully fluorinated carbon
7		atom.
8	(2)	On or before January 1, 2022, the cabinet shall promulgate administrative
9		regulations pursuant to KRS Chapter 13A establishing maximum PFAS
10		chemical limits and monitoring requirements for drinking water provided by
11		public and semi-public water systems regulated under this chapter or KRS
12		<u>Chapter 151.</u>
13	<u>(</u> 3)	On or before January 1, 2022, the cabinet shall promulgate administrative
14		regulations pursuant to KRS Chapter 13A establishing maximum PFAS
15		chemical limits and monitoring requirements for discharges into the waters of
16		the Commonwealth.
17	<u>(4)</u>	Any maximum PFAS chemical limits promulgated under this section shall be set
18		at levels designed to protect public health, and shall be updated from time to time
19		to reflect the latest scientific understanding of the impact of PFAS chemicals on
20		human health.
21	<u>(5)</u>	Nothing in this section shall be construed to change or interfere with the
22		cabinet's enforcement of or any other obligations under the federal Water
23		Pollution Control Act, 33 U.S.C. secs. 1251 et seq., or the federal Safe Drinking

25		→ Section 2. KRS 227.395 is amended to read as follows:
26	(1)	As used in this section:
27		(a) "Class B firefighting foam" means foams designed for flammable liquid fires;

- (b) "PFAS chemicals" means perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances
 which, for the purpose of firefighting agents, is a class of fluorinated organic
 chemicals containing at least one (1) fully fluorinated carbon atom; and
- 4 (c) "Testing" means calibration testing, conformance testing, and fixed system
 5 testing.

6 (2) Beginning on July 15, 2020, class B firefighting foam that contains intentionally
7 added PFAS chemicals shall not be used for firefighting training purposes or testing
8 purposes unless otherwise required by law, regulation, or ordinance, and the testing
9 facility has implemented best industry practices to prevent uncontrolled releases of
10 class B firefighting foam in the environment. Violation of this subsection shall be
11 subject to KRS 227.336.

- 12(3)Beginning on January 1, 2022, firefighting personal protection equipment that13contains intentionally added PFAS chemicals shall not be used for firefighting or
- 14 firefighting training purposes. Violations of this subsection shall be subject to

16 (4) The restrictions in subsection (2) of this section shall not apply to:

- 17 (a) The manufacture, sale, or distribution of class B firefighting foam that
 18 contains intentionally added PFAS chemicals; or
- (b) The discharge or other use of class B firefighting foam that contains
 intentionally added PFAS chemicals in emergency firefighting operations.
