1		AN ACT relating to the Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities.
2	Be it	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 222 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	The Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities is hereby created and
6		shall be attached to the Office of Drug Control Policy within the Justice and
7		Public Safety Cabinet for administrative purposes.
8	<u>(2)</u>	The Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities shall consist of the
9		following members appointed by the Governor:
10		(a) One (1) representative from the Kentucky League of Cities;
11		(b) One (1) representative from the Kentucky Association of Counties;
12		(c) One (1) representative from the Kentucky Chamber of Commerce;
13		(d) One (1) representative from the Recovery Consortium of Kentucky;
14		(e) One (1) representative from the Kentucky School Boards Association;
15		(f) One (1) representative that represents the leadership of active law
16		enforcement officers in Kentucky;
17		(g) One (1) representative that is a practicing physician with an active license
18		in Kentucky representing the medical profession;
19		(h) Two (2) representatives from the Administrative Office of the Courts, one
20		(1) of whom shall have experience in the prosecution of drug-related
21		offenses and one (1) of whom shall be a judge or retired judge with
22		experience in presiding over cases involving drug-related offenses;
23		(i) One (1) representative from a family advocate organization who shall have
24		experience in substance use recovery disorders; and
25		(j) One (1) representative from a faith community organization who shall have
26		experience in substance use recovery disorders.
27		The Governor shall designate a chairperson.

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1	<u>(3)</u>	Appointed members of the Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities
2		shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed for actual expenses
3		incurred in the performance of duties in accordance with KRS 45.101 and
4		administrative regulations promulgated thereunder.
5	<u>(4)</u>	The Governor shall appoint advisory council members who reflect, inasmuch as
6		possible, the political, geographic, gender, age, and racial diversity of the
7		population of the Commonwealth.
8	<u>(5)</u>	The Advisory Council for Recovery Ready Communities shall:
9		(a) Establish a Kentucky Recovery Ready Community Certification Program
10		for cities and counties. The purpose of the certification program is to
11		provide a quality measure of a city's or county's substance use disorder
12		recovery programs and to assure citizens and businesses that a city or
13		county is committed to ensuring the availability of high quality recovery
14		programs in its community that can help lead to a highly skilled community
15		workforce;
16		(b) Establish guidelines, protocols, standards, and an application and approval
17		process for cities and counties related to the Kentucky Recovery Ready
18		Community Certification Program;
19		(c) Ensure that the certification process evaluates a city's or county's
20		availability of high quality substance use treatment programs in their
21		communities for persons in active, post, and recovered addiction status;
22		(d) Request and utilize federal, state, and private funds, including funds from
23		philanthropic sources;
24		(e) Improve procedures for ensuring accountability and measuring success of
25		recovery programs that receive state, federal, and philanthropic funds; and
26		(f) Other duties and responsibilities as designated by the Governor.
27	<u>(6)</u>	The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet may contract with any public or private

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1		agency or any individual for research, the gathering of information, the printing
2		and publication of reports, consulting, or for any other purpose necessary to
3		discharge the duties of the advisory council.
4	<u>(7)</u>	The Justice and Public Safety Cabinet, in collaboration with the Advisory
5		Council for Recovery Ready Communities created under subsection (1) of this
6		section, may promulgate administrative regulations pursuant to KRS Chapter
7		13A to carry out this section.
