1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION urging Congress to take appropriate steps to
2	assist businesses facing increasing unemployment insurance liabilities.
3	WHEREAS, prior to the COVID-19 outbreak, Kentucky's Unemployment Insurance
4	Fund ("UI Fund") contained approximately \$619,000,000; and
5	WHEREAS, since the COVID-19 outbreak, over 1,200,000 unemployment benefits
6	claims were filed in the Commonwealth, which is more than half of Kentucky's
7	workforce; and
8	WHEREAS, on July 1, 2020, the federal government approved Kentucky to receive
9	a Federal Unemployment Insurance Title XII advance ("Federal UI loan") in the amount
10	of \$865,000,000; and
11	WHEREAS, as of the end of 2020, Kentucky's UI Fund will have a projected deficit
12	of \$620,000,000; and
13	WHEREAS, interest on Kentucky's Federal UI loan began to accrue on January 1,
14	2021; and
15	WHEREAS, in the event of an outstanding balance on Kentucky's Federal UI loan
16	after two years, employers in the Commonwealth will be subject to a Federal
17	Unemployment Insurance ("FUTA") tax credit reduction; and a benefit cost rate penalty if
18	the balance is outstanding after five years; and
19	WHEREAS, the effect of a FUTA tax credit reduction and benefit cost rate penalty
20	is an increase in the federal unemployment tax to be paid by Kentucky employers; and
21	WHEREAS, given Kentucky's current UI Fund balance, the aggressive repayment
22	schedule already adopted to replenish the UI fund, and the ongoing challenges of COVID-
23	19, employers in the Commonwealth face a tremendous burden; and
24	WHEREAS, the businesses of Kentucky that stepped up to limit the spread of the
25	virus and made tremendous sacrifices deserve relief from unemployment insurance cost
26	increases;
27	NOW, THEREFORE,

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2	Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:
3	→Section 1. The Kentucky General Assembly urges the United States Congress to
4	forgive Kentucky's outstanding Federal UI loan balance.
5	Section 2. If the loans are not forgiven, the General Assembly asks that
6	Congress indefinitely suspend interest accrual on Kentucky's Federal UI loan, freeze the
7	state's unemployment tax credit rate as applied against the federal unemployment tax at
8	the end of the year, and suspend the FUTA credit reduction and benefit cost rate penalty.
9	Section 3. Upon passage of this Resolution by the General Assembly, the Clerk
10	of the House of Representatives shall send a copy of this Resolution to:
11	(1) Kentucky's United States Senators, Senator Mitch McConnell and Senator Paul
12	Rand;
13	(2) All members of the Kentucky Congressional Delegation;
14	(3) The Clerk of the United States House of Representatives; and
15	(4) The Clerk of the United States Senate.
