1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION encouraging the Kentucky General Assembly to
2	take steps to allow public input and hold public hearings during the redistricting process.
3	WHEREAS, fair elections are fundamental to the democratic process; and
4	WHEREAS, fairly drawn electoral districts are fundamental to fair elections; and
5	WHEREAS, a transparent redistricting process, one that includes public hearings,
6	the opportunity for credible interest groups or individuals to present proposals of their
7	own, and the opportunity for comment on maps submitted to the General Assembly for
8	consideration prior to a vote will help engender public confidence in the integrity of the
9	election process; and
10	WHEREAS, a closed redistricting process, one in which legislative districts are
11	drawn by political parties with no public input or scrutiny, will weaken public confidence
12	in the political process; and
13	WHEREAS, Kentucky's 2020 elections, through a bipartisan agreement on polling
14	places, absentee ballots, drop boxes and other details, created better confidence in our
15	democratic elections in contrast to other states that saw fierce rancor and expensive
16	litigation; and
17	WHEREAS, nationally, and in states and communities across the country, partisan
18	divisions have raised tensions to levels rarely seen in American history; and
19	WHEREAS, this is simply not a time to allow politics to intrude excessively into
20	something as fundamental as a redistricting plan that will govern Kentucky
21	Congressional, Kentucky House of Representatives, and Kentucky Senate maps for a
22	decade to come; and
23	WHEREAS, moderate legislators are bailing out of politics all together because
24	partisan gridlock, largely caused by pressures related to primary races in heavily
25	gerrymandered districts, is pushing politics to the extremes and making compromise all
26	but impossible; and
27	WHEREAS, significant population shifts in Kentucky over the past decade will

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require significant redrawing of legislative districts for the Kentucky House of
 Representatives, Kentucky Senate, and Kentucky Congressional districts; and

3 WHEREAS, a good faith effort to keep partisanship to a minimum through the 4 redistricting process is the best way to instill confidence in the democratic process of 5 electing our representatives; and

6 WHEREAS, the General Assembly intends to use a transparent process for revising 7 districts, to consider the thoughts and concerns of citizens before adopting new 8 boundaries, and to adopt final maps that are fully consistent with constitutional 9 requirements, applicable laws, and the principle of equal respect for all citizens of the 10 Commonwealth;

11 NOW, THEREFORE,

12 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 13 Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:

Section 1. The General Assembly agrees that in setting new boundaries for
legislative districts, it is good practice to seek robust citizen input, offer opportunities for
citizens to review proposed boundaries, and allow a reasonable period of time for citizens
to prepare and submit comments, concerns, and revision requests before any legislative
votes.

19 → Section 2. The Kentucky General Assembly is encouraged to incorporate
20 opportunities for public input in redistricting laws and to take steps to allow public input
21 in the redrawing of legislative district lines.

Section 3. The Kentucky General Assembly is further encouraged to hold public
hearings to allow input from citizens, organizations, and stakeholders.

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
