1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION to create a legislative workgroup on returning
2	women and mothers to work who are unemployed due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
3	WHEREAS, according to the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics, the labor
4	force participation rate in Kentucky has been dropping steadily since 1999; and
5	WHEREAS, in 1999 the Kentucky labor force participation rate was 64.1 percent
6	and it is currently at 57.5 percent; and
7	WHEREAS, even before COVID-19, the workforce participation rate was low
8	among women in comparison to their male counterparts; and
9	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic pushed the unemployment rate to an all-time
10	high of 16.6 percent in April 2020, and the labor force participation rate dropped to a
11	historic low of 52.5 percent; and
12	WHEREAS, of the unemployment insurance claimants that filed for benefits as a
13	result of COVID-19, women are the majority of all claimants in Kentucky; and
14	WHEREAS, women are the majority of workers in the private industry most
15	heavily affected by the pandemic and are largely underrepresented in insulated industries;
16	and
17	WHEREAS, women are experiencing record unemployment in Kentucky, in terms
18	of both number of workers and the percentage of overall unemployment claimants for
19	which they account; and
20	WHEREAS, mothers experience the longest stints on unemployment assistance
21	with an average of 13.1 weeks, and nonretired women cite childcare as their most
22	common reason for not working; and
23	WHEREAS, the number of nonretired women in Kentucky currently not working in
24	order to meet household childcare needs exceeds 100,000; and
25	WHEREAS, the COVID-19 pandemic is disproportionately hurting Kentucky
26	women and mothers;

1 Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the 2 *Commonwealth of Kentucky, the Senate concurring therein:* 3 → Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission shall establish the Returning 4 Women and Mothers to Work workgroup to investigate the impact of COVID-19 on 5 women and mothers in Kentucky. 6 \blacksquare Section 2. The duties of the workgroup shall include but not be limited to 7 investigating: 8 The full impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on women in the workforce; (1)9 (2)The full impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on mothers in the workforce; 10 Barriers to successful re-entry to the workforce; and (3) 11 Strategies to return unemployed women and mothers to the workforce. (4) 12 \rightarrow Section 3. The workgroup shall be composed of the following members, with 13 final membership of the workgroup subject to the consideration and approval of the 14 Legislative Research Commission: (1) Four Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House of 15 16 Representatives, with equal minority and majority representation; and 17 Four Senators appointed by the President of the Senate, with equal minority (2)18 and majority representation. 19 \rightarrow Section 4. The workgroup shall meet for the 2021 Interim of the General 20 Assembly and shall make findings and recommendations on the appropriate measures the 21 state can take to return women and mothers to the workforce to the Legislative Research 22 Commission by December 1, 2021. 23 \rightarrow Section 5. The executive branch of government, including the Kentucky 24 Workforce Innovation Board, shall promptly provide necessary data, research, and other 25 requested information to assist the workgroup in the performance of its duties.

26 → Section 6. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the
27 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the

- 1 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof, and to
- 2 designate a study completion date.
