

1           A RESOLUTION to date House of Representatives resolutions and House of  
2 Representatives legislative citations in the Year of our Lord.

3           WHEREAS, for hundreds of years, prominent universities such as Harvard, which  
4 was founded in 1636, and Princeton, which was founded in 1746, have dated their  
5 diplomas in the Year of our Lord; and

6           WHEREAS, John Hanson, President of the Continental Congress, issued a  
7 Proclamation on October 11, 1782, proclaiming November 28, 1782, as a national day of  
8 Thanksgiving and signed it in the Year of our Lord; and

9           WHEREAS, The United States Constitution, Article 7, states, "done in Convention  
10 by the Unanimous Consent of the States present the Seventeenth Day of September in the  
11 Year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Eighty seven and of the Independence  
12 of the United States of America the Twelfth. In witness whereof we have hereunto  
13 subscribed our Names"; and

14           WHEREAS, Kentucky's 1891 Constitution was dated in the Year of our Lord; and

15           WHEREAS, Massachusetts Governor John Hancock issued a Proclamation on  
16 October 28, 1784, setting forth November 25, 1784, as a national day of Thanksgiving  
17 and signed it in the Year of our Lord; and

18           WHEREAS, ordained by the assembled United States Congress, the Northwest  
19 Ordinance was signed July 13, 1787, in the Year of our Lord; and

20           WHEREAS, Governor John Hancock of Massachusetts issued a Proclamation on  
21 October 5, 1791, to set November 17, 1791, as a national day of Thanksgiving and dated  
22 it in the Year of our Lord; and

23           WHEREAS, on September 24, 1807, President Thomas Jefferson signed an official  
24 presidential document giving permission for the ship "Herschel" to proceed on its journey  
25 to the Port of London and dated it in the Year of our Lord Christ; and

26           WHEREAS, President Abraham Lincoln signed the Emancipation Proclamation  
27 freeing slaves in the United States of America, dated January 1, 1863, in the Year of our

1 Lord; and

2 WHEREAS, President William H. Taft issued a Thanksgiving Day Proclamation on  
3 November 15, 1909, making November 25, 1909, the day to observe national  
4 Thanksgiving, and dated it in the Year of our Lord; and

5 WHEREAS, Kentucky Governor Matt Bevin signed all proclamations, including  
6 his December 19, 2016, proclamation declaring 2017 to be the Year of the Bible in  
7 Kentucky, in the Year of our Lord;

8 NOW, THEREFORE,

9 *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the*  
10 *Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

11 ➔Section 1. The House of Representatives shall follow the lofty example set in  
12 the United States Constitution and other significant founding documents by including "in  
13 the Year of our Lord" in the adopted date of all House of Representatives simple  
14 resolutions that are put on parchment at the direction of the Clerk.

15 ➔Section 2. The House of Representatives shall include "in the Year of our Lord"  
16 in the date of all House of Representatives floor citations.

17 ➔Section 3. The House of Representatives shall work with the Legislative  
18 Research Commission to include "in the Year of our Lord" on all other House of  
19 Representatives citations throughout the year.
