1 A RESOLUTION encouraging high schools to offer annual government instruction.

2 WHEREAS, President Thomas Jefferson famously described a well-informed
3 electorate as a prerequisite to a properly functioning democracy; and

WHEREAS, a general understanding of how local government functions is critical
to understanding the context of actions taken by federal, state, and local governments and
is therefore essential to creating a well-informed electorate; and

WHEREAS, familiarity with how local government functions may inspire young
people to participate in local politics, seek out mentorship and networking opportunities,
and become more involved in their communities;

10 NOW, THEREFORE,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the
Commonwealth of Kentucky:

13 \rightarrow Section 1. High schools across Kentucky are strongly encouraged to offer all 14 students at least 3 hours of annual, nonpartisan instruction on the roles and functions of 15 city, county, and state government. The encouraged instruction may incorporate 16 attendance at a government meeting, a presentation from a state or local government 17 official, or a field trip to a state or local government building. This instruction may be 18 incorporated into relevant classroom instruction or be covered as part of a school or class 19 assembly. Schools should reach out to local youth organizations, such as the Boys & Girls 20 Clubs, to assist in the provision of the instruction. The topics covered should include but 21 are not limited to:

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(1) The duties, terms, and identity of local and state government officers;

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(2) Elections, election rules, and voter registration;

24 (3) The relationship between local, state, and federal government with an
25 emphasis on the specific responsibilities of local government;

(4) Local and state taxes, including an explanation of how individual and business
tax liability is calculated and identification of agencies that are funded by local and state

1 tax revenue; and

- 2 (5) Relevant topics that are specific to the school's community.
