- 1 AN ACT relating to elections.
- 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
- 3 → Section 1. KRS 117.125 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 No make of voting machine shall be approved for use unless it is so constructed that:
- 5 (1) It will *ensure*[insure] secrecy to the voter in the act of voting.
- 6 (2) It provides facilities that will permit votes to be cast for any candidate entitled to
- have his <u>or her</u> name printed upon the ballots at any <u>primary</u>, regular <u>election</u>, <u>or</u>
- 8 special or primary election, and for or against any public question entitled to be
- 9 placed upon the ballots.
- 10 (3) It will, except at primary elections, permit a voter to vote for all the candidates of
- one (1) party or for one (1) or more candidates of every party having candidates
- entitled to be voted for, or for one (1) or more independent candidates.
- 13 (4) It will permit a voter to vote for as many persons for an office as he *or she* is
- lawfully entitled to vote for, and no more.
- 15 (5) It will prevent a voter from voting for the same person, or for or against the same
- 16 question, more than once.
- 17 (6) It will permit a voter to vote for or against any question he *or she* may have the
- right to vote on, but no other.
- 19 (7) It may be adjusted for use in primary elections so that a voter may not vote for any
- 20 person except those seeking nomination as candidates of his *or her* party or as
- 21 candidates for an office of the Court of Justice.
- 22 (8) It will correctly register and accurately count all votes cast for each person, and for
- or against each public question.
- 24 (9) It can be determined whether the machine has been unlocked and operated after
- once being locked.
- 26 (10) It will show at all times during an election how many persons have voted by a
- device hereinafter referred to as a public counter.

1	(11)	The counter indicating the number of votes cast for each person and for or against
2		each public question cannot be seen or tampered with without unlocking a covering
3		device that cannot be unlocked by a key that unlocks any other part of the machine.
4		When such counters are so exposed the machine can no longer be placed into
5		condition for operation without the use of a special key, which key shall not have
6		been in the possession of the election officers at the polling places; but if this
7		requirement has the effect of eliminating from consideration any other make of
8		machine such requirement shall not apply.

- 9 (12) The operating device and operating mechanism may be locked before the time for opening the polls and after the time for closing the polls.
- 11 (13) It is accompanied by a mechanical model illustrating the manner of voting on the machine, suitable for the instruction of voters.
- 13 (14) It will permit a voter to vote for all the candidates for presidential electors of any 14 party by one (1) operation.
- 15 (15) It will permit a voter to vote, in any regular <u>election</u> or special election, for any person desired to be voted for whose name does not appear upon the voting machine.
- 18 (16) It bears a number that will distinguish it from any other machine.
- 19 (17) It shall not be connected, nor shall it have the ability to be connected to the

 20 Internet, a modem, or a network of any type[The frames in which ballot labels are
 21 placed shall be constructed with transparent protective devices, in order that the
 22 names thereon cannot be mutilated or altered].
- → Section 2. KRS 117.381 is amended to read as follows:
- No electronic voting system shall, upon any examination or reexamination, be approved
- 25 by the State Board of Elections unless it shall be established that such system, at the time
- of examination or reexamination:
- 27 (1) Provides for voting in secrecy;

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1 (2) Permits each voter to vote at any election for all candidates and questions for which

- 2 he <u>or she</u> is lawfully entitled to vote, and no others;
- 3 (3) Permits each voter, at the <u>regular[general]</u> election to vote a straight political party
- 4 ticket by one (1) or more marks or acts;
- 5 (4) Provides a method for write-in voting;
- 6 (5) Provides for a nonpartisan ballot;
- 7 (6) If it is of a type that registers the vote electronically, the voting system shall
- 8 preclude each voter from voting for more persons for any office than he *or she* is
- 9 entitled to vote for or upon any question more than once;
- 10 (7) Permits each voter at a primary [election] to vote only for the candidates seeking
- 11 nomination by a political party in which such voter is registered, and for any
- candidate for nonpartisan nomination, and for any question upon which he *or she* is
- entitled to vote;
- 14 (8) If it is of a type that registers the vote electronically, the voting system shall permit
- each voter to change his *or her* vote for any candidate or upon any question
- appearing on the official ballot up to the time that he *or she* takes the final step to
- 17 register his *or her* vote and to have his vote computed. If it is of a type that uses
- paper ballots or ballot cards to register the vote and automatic tabulating equipment
- to compute such votes, the system shall provide that a voter who spoils his *or her*
- 20 ballot may obtain another ballot;
- 21 (9) Is suitably designed for the purpose used, is constructed of a durable material, and is
- safely transportable;
- 23 (10) Is so constructed that a voter may readily learn the method of operating it; and
- 24 (11) Meets or exceeds the standards for electronic voting equipment established by the
- 25 Federal Election Commission; and
- 26 (12) Provides for tabulating votes at the precinct in accordance with the requirements of
- 27 KRS 117.275; and

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1 (13) It shall not be connected, nor shall it have the ability to be connected to the

2 <u>Internet, a modem, or a network of any type</u>.
