1 AN ACT relating to elections.

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2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 117.035 is amended to read as follows:
- There shall be a county board of elections, which shall, at the direction and under the supervision of the State Board of Elections, administer the election laws and the registration and purgation of voters within the county.
- 7 (2) (a) The board shall consist of the county clerk, the sheriff, and two (2) members
 8 appointed by the State Board of Elections not later than July 1 following the
 9 election *for President and Vice President of the United States* [of persons to
 10 statewide office], for a term of four (4) years and until their successors are
 11 appointed.
 - (b) The sheriff shall not serve on the board during any year in which he or she is a candidate, but shall recommend to the board a temporary replacement to serve in his or her place. If the sheriff cannot serve because he or she is sick, injured, or otherwise incapacitated, he or she may recommend a temporary replacement to serve in his or her place until the sheriff may resume his or her duties or a vacancy in office is declared.
 - (c) The county clerk may, at his or her option, continue to serve on the board during a year in which he or she is a candidate. If the clerk elects not to serve, he or she shall recommend a temporary replacement to serve in his or her place. If the county clerk cannot serve because he or she is sick, injured, or otherwise incapacitated, he or she may recommend a temporary replacement to serve in his or her place until the county clerk may resume his or her duties or a vacancy in office is declared.
 - (d) 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of KRS 61.080, service on the board of elections shall be compatible with the holding of any other county or city office.

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2.	The members shall be at least twenty-one (21) years of age, qualified
	voters in the county from which they are appointed, and shall not have
	been convicted of any election law offense.

- 3. One (1) member shall be appointed from a *nomination*[list of five (5) names] submitted by the county executive committee of each political party as defined in KRS 118.015. If there are two (2) or more contending executive committees of the same political party in any county, the one recognized by the written certificate of the chair of the state central committee of the political party shall be the one authorized to submit the *nomination*[lists].
- 4. If the State Board of Elections <u>rejects the nomination or</u> does not receive the <u>nomination</u>[list] as required by subparagraph 3. of this paragraph for each political party for each county by the deadline established in paragraph (a) of this subsection or within one (1) month of a vacancy, then the chair of the state central committees for the political parties may submit <u>the nomination[lists of five (5) names]</u> of qualified residents from the <u>county or counties whose nomination was rejected, or the</u> remaining counties by August 1 <u>of the year in which the term expires, [following the election of persons to statewide office]</u> or within two (2) months of a vacancy.
- 5. If the State Board of Elections does not receive a <u>nomination[list]</u> from either the county executive committee under subparagraph 3. of this paragraph or the chair of the state executive committee under subparagraph 4. of this paragraph, then the State Board of Elections shall appoint a qualified resident from the county at its next regularly scheduled meeting in September following the election of <u>for President</u> and Vice President of the United States[persons to statewide office] or

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1			within three (3) months of a vacancy.
2		6.	A member appointed by the State Board of Elections may be removed
3			by the State Board of Elections for cause.
4		7.	A member appointed by the State Board of Elections may be removed
5			by the State Board of Elections upon a request approved by a two-thirds
6			(2/3) vote of the full membership of the county executive committee that
7			submitted the member's name. The county executive shall provide
8			conclusive evidence of the committee's membership and evidence of the
9			committee's two-thirds (2/3) vote before the State Board of Elections
10			removes any member appointed by the State Board of Elections.
11		8.	If an appointee is temporarily unable to act, a temporary appointee shall
12			be named by the State Board of Elections. A temporary appointee shall
13			serve until the original appointee notifies the State Board of Elections
14			that he or she is able to resume his or her term.
15		9.	A member appointed by the State Board of Elections shall not serve on
16			the board if he or she is a candidate for public office, and the member
17			shall resign upon filing papers to become a candidate for public office or
18			shall be removed from office by the State Board of Elections. A member
19			who resigns or is removed because of his or her candidacy shall not
20			resume his or her term following the completion of the candidacy.
21		10.	Vacancies and temporary vacancies shall be filled in the same manner as
22			provided for original appointments, and the person appointed to fill the
23			vacancy or temporary vacancy shall be of the same political party as his
24			or her predecessor.
25	(e)	Con	ppensation and payment of actual expenses of members shall be set by the

fiscal court either as an amount payable on an annual basis, or as an amount

payable on a per diem basis of not less than fifteen dollars (\$15) nor more than

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one hundred dollars (\$100) for each day the	board meets.
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2 A majority of the board shall constitute a quorum. The county clerk shall serve as (3) 3 chair of the meetings and may vote. In case of a tie, the chair may cast an additional vote. Records shall be kept of all proceedings, and the records shall be public and kept at the office of the county clerk.

6 (4) The board shall meet as follows:

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- During years in which a primary or regular election is scheduled, the board (a) shall meet at least once every other month and may meet more frequently if necessary upon the call of the chair or upon written agreement of two (2) or more members of the board. The call shall provide notice as prescribed by KRS 61.823.
 - (b) During years in which no primary or regular election is scheduled, the board shall meet at the call of the chair or upon written agreement of two (2) or more members of the board. The call shall provide notice as prescribed by KRS 61.823.
 - (c) The board shall meet and stay in session on primary, regular election, and special election days to correct clerical errors, to rule on questions regarding voter registration and proof of identification, and may make to the election officers such certifications as may be necessary. On primary, regular election, and special election days, appeals may be made to a Circuit Judge, but a ruling of the board shall be reversed only upon a finding that it was arbitrary and capricious.
- 23 The board may employ, on a bipartisan basis, a staff sufficient to carry out the 24 duties assigned to the board.
- 25 → Section 2. KRS 117.125 is amended to read as follows:
- 26 No make of voting machine shall be approved for use unless it is so constructed that:
- 27 It will *ensure*[insure] secrecy to the voter in the act of voting. (1)

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1	(2)	It provides facilities that will permit votes to be cast for any candidate entitled to
2		have his <u>or her</u> name printed upon the ballots at any <u>primary</u> , regular <u>election</u> , <u>or</u>
3		special[or primary] election, and for or against any public question entitled to be
4		placed upon the ballots.

- 5 (3) It will, except at <u>a</u> primary [elections], permit a voter to vote for all the candidates of one (1) party or for one (1) or more candidates of every party having candidates entitled to be voted for, or for one (1) or more independent candidates.
- 8 (4) It will permit a voter to vote for as many persons for an office as *the voter*[he] is lawfully entitled to vote for, and no more.
- 10 (5) It will prevent a voter from voting for the same person, or for or against the same question, more than once.
- 12 (6) It will permit a voter to vote for or against any question <u>the voter</u>[he] may have the right to vote on, but no other.
- 14 (7) It may be adjusted for use in *primaries*[primary elections] so that a voter may not
 15 vote for any person except those seeking nomination as candidates of *the*16 *voter's*[his] party or as candidates for an office of the Court of Justice.
- 17 (8) It will correctly register and accurately count all votes cast for each person, and for 18 or against each public question.
- 19 (9) It can be determined whether the machine has been unlocked and operated after 20 once being locked.
- 21 (10) It will show at all times during an election how many persons have voted by a 22 device hereinafter referred to as a public counter.
- 23 (11) The counter indicating the number of votes cast for each person and for or against 24 each public question cannot be seen or tampered with without unlocking a covering 25 device that cannot be unlocked by a key that unlocks any other part of the machine. 26 When such counters are so exposed the machine can no longer be placed into 27 condition for operation without the use of a special key, which key shall not have

been in the possession of the election officers at the polling places; but if this

- 2 requirement has the effect of eliminating from consideration any other make of
- 3 machine such requirement shall not apply.
- 4 (12) The operating device and operating mechanism may be locked before the time for
- 5 opening the polls and after the time for closing the polls.
- 6 (13) It is accompanied by a mechanical model illustrating the manner of voting on the
- 7 machine, suitable for the instruction of voters.
- 8 (14) It will permit a voter to vote for all the candidates for presidential electors of any
- 9 party by one (1) operation.
- 10 (15) It will permit a voter to vote, in any regular *election* or special election, for any
- person desired to be voted for whose name does not appear upon the voting
- machine.
- 13 (16) It bears a number that will distinguish it from any other machine.
- 14 (17) It shall not be connected to the Internet[The frames in which ballot labels are
- 15 placed shall be constructed with transparent protective devices, in order that the
- 16 names thereon cannot be mutilated or altered.
- → Section 3. KRS 117.381 is amended to read as follows:
- No electronic voting system shall, upon any examination or reexamination, be approved
- by the State Board of Elections unless it shall be established that such system, at the time
- 20 of examination or reexamination:
- 21 (1) Provides for voting in secrecy;
- 22 (2) Permits each voter to vote at any election for all candidates and questions for which
- 23 <u>the voter[he]</u> is lawfully entitled to vote, and no others;
- 24 (3) Permits each voter, at the *regular*[general] election to vote a straight political party
- 25 ticket by one (1) or more marks or acts;
- 26 (4) Provides a method for write-in voting;
- 27 (5) Provides for a nonpartisan ballot;

1	(6)	If it is of a type that registers the vote electronically, the voting system shall
2		preclude each voter from voting for more persons for any office than <u>the voter</u> [he]
3		is entitled to vote for or upon any question more than once;

- Permits each voter at a primary [election] to vote only for the candidates seeking nomination by a political party in which such voter is registered, and for any candidate for nonpartisan nomination, and for any question upon which the voter [he] is entitled to vote;
- 8 (8) If it is of a type that registers the vote electronically, the voting system shall permit
 9 each voter to change his <u>or her</u> vote for any candidate or upon any question
 10 appearing on the official ballot up to the time that <u>the voter</u>[he] takes the final step
 11 to register his <u>or her</u> vote and to have his <u>or her</u> vote computed. If it is of a type
 12 that uses paper ballots or ballot cards to register the vote and automatic tabulating
 13 equipment to compute such votes, the system shall provide that a voter who spoils
 14 his **or her** ballot may obtain another ballot;
- 15 (9) Is suitably designed for the purpose used, is constructed of a durable material, and is safely transportable;
- 17 (10) Is so constructed that a voter may readily learn the method of operating it; and
- 18 (11) Meets or exceeds the standards for electronic voting equipment established by the
- 19 Federal Election Commission; [and]
- 20 (12) Provides for tabulating votes at the precinct in accordance with the requirements of
- 21 KRS 117.275<u>; and</u>

22 (13) Shall not be connected to the Internet.

Section 4. As a schedule of transitional provisions, those members appointed under Section 1 of this Act by the State Board of Elections in 2024 shall serve for a term of three (3) years and until their successors are appointed in 2027. Beginning in 2027, and for each term thereafter, members of the county board of elections appointed by the State Board of Elections shall serve for a term of four (4) years and until their successors are

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1 appointed.
