22	<u>unemployment insurance in Kentucky.</u>

12		is participating in the unemployment compensation insurance program has

15		access to information about pending unemployment insurance claims, and
16		status of appealed claims;
17	<u>(h</u>)	Promulgate, adopt and implement internal administrative regulations and
18		policies to recover improper overpayments of unemployment benefits;
19	<u>(i)</u>	Require at least two-factor authentication from every benefit applicant prior
20		to payment of any benefit; and
21	<u>(j)</u>	Maintain records of any and all applications for waiver of overpayment.
22	<u>(2) Th</u>	e department shall complete an annual report for the Legislative Research
23	<u>Co</u>	mmission which details efforts to recover improper benefit payments, causes of
24	<u>im</u>	proper unemployment benefit payments, measures implemented to avoid
25	<u>im</u>	proper benefit payments, summarizes all cases where repayment was not
26	att	empted due to a statutory exception, and analyzes any cost savings to the
27	<u>Co</u>	mmonwealth. The department shall provide this report to the Legislative

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Research Commission annually, no later than October 1.

Section 4. Whereas the COVID-19 pandemic has caused significant hardship
for unemployment insurance recipients who have previously been overpaid benefits
which they are now required to repay, an emergency is declared to exist, and this Act
takes effect upon its passage and approval by the Governor or upon its otherwise
becoming a law.
