1 AN ACT relating to licensed diabetes educators.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 309.325 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 As used in KRS 309.325 to 309.339, unless the context requires otherwise:
- 5 (1) "Board" means the Kentucky Board of Licensed Diabetes Care and Education
- 6 **Specialists**[Educators];
- 7 (2) "Diabetes <u>care and</u> education" means a comprehensive collaborative process
- 8 through which people with or at risk for diabetes gain the knowledge and skills
- 9 needed to modify behavior and successfully self-manage the disease and its related
- 10 conditions;
- 11 (3) "Licensed diabetes care and education specialist[educator]" means a health care
- 12 professional who has met the requirements of KRS 309.335, 309.337, and 309.339
- 13 and who focuses on training or educating people with or at risk for diabetes and
- 14 related conditions to change their behavior to achieve better clinical outcomes and
- 15 improved health status. The nondiabetes educator health professional and the
- 16 nonhealth-care professional who provide or support health care services to
- 17 individuals with diabetes, as defined by the American Association of Diabetes
- 18 Care & Education Specialists [Educators], and those working to complete their
- 19 competencies for Diabetes Care and Education Specialists [Educators,] shall work
- 20 under the direction of a qualified diabetes care *and education specialist*[provider];
- 21 "Practice of diabetes *care and* education" means assessing and developing a plan of (4)
- 22 care for a person with or at risk of diabetes, identifying self-management goals for
- 23 the person, providing self-management training according to the plan, evaluating
- 24 the individual's outcome and recording a complete record of the individual's
- 25 experience and follow-ups;
- "Apprentice diabetes *care and education specialist*[educator]" means a person who 26 (5)
- 27 holds a permit issued by the board to practice diabetes care and education who

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1 meets the requirements of KRS 309.334 and the corresponding administrative 2 regulations promulgated by the board; and

- 3 (6) "Master licensed diabetes <u>care and education specialist</u>[educator]" means a
 4 licensed diabetes <u>and education specialist</u>[educator] who has successfully
 5 completed the credentialing program of the <u>[American]</u> Association of Diabetes
 6 <u>Care & Education Specialists</u>, <u>[Educators]</u> or the <u>[National]</u> Certification Board for
 7 Diabetes <u>Care and Education</u> <u>[Educators]</u> as a certified diabetes <u>care and</u>
 8 <u>education specialist</u> <u>[educator]</u> or a board-certified advanced diabetes <u>care and</u>
 9 education specialist manager.
- Section 2. KRS 309.327 is amended to read as follows:
- A person shall use the title "master licensed diabetes care and education 11 (1) 12 specialist[educator]," "licensed diabetes care and education specialist[educator]," or "apprentice diabetes *care and education specialist*[educator]" or hold himself or 13 14 herself out as a "master licensed diabetes care and education specialist[educator]," 15 "licensed diabetes *care and education specialist*[educator]," or "apprentice diabetes care and education specialist[educator]" or a title substantially similar, or engage 16 17 in the practice of diabetes *care and* education, display a sign or in any other way 18 advertise or present himself or herself as a person who practices diabetes care and 19 education only if he or she holds a current, unsuspended and unrevoked license or 20 permit issued by the board pursuant to KRS 309.325 to 309.339.
- 21 (2) Nothing in KRS 309.325 to 309.339 shall apply to persons licensed, certified, or registered under any other provision of the Kentucky Revised Statutes, including but not limited to physicians, nurses, pharmacists, dietitians, and nutritionists or students in accredited training programs in those professions, and nothing in KRS 309.325 to 309.339 shall be construed to limit, interfere with, or restrict the practice, descriptions of services, or manner in which they hold themselves out to the public.

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- 2 (2) (a) The Governor shall initially appoint one (1) member and the citizen at large to
- 3 terms of four (4) years, two (2) members to terms of three (3) years, and one
- 4 (1) member to a term of two (2) years.
- 5 (b) All reappointments to the board shall be for terms of four (4) years.
- 6 (c) No member shall serve more than two (2) consecutive terms and shall serve

11		educator, may apply to the board for licensure as a diabetes educator by submitting
12		the initial licensure fee and proof of employment, in order to continue to practice
