1	A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION reestablishing the Public Water and Wastewater
2	System Infrastructure Task Force.
3	WHEREAS, water is a critical natural resource for Kentucky; and
4	WHEREAS, Kentucky's water and wastewater infrastructure, including drinking
5	water treatment plants and distribution systems, wastewater treatment plants and
6	collection systems, and dams, is critical to Kentucky's public health and safety, economic
7	development, environmental sustainability, and quality of life; and
8	WHEREAS, there are approximately 450 public drinking water systems in
9	Kentucky that serve more than 95 percent of the population, and the majority of
10	Kentucky's citizens are connected to regional wastewater service; and
11	WHEREAS, these systems include municipalities, boards, associations, districts,
12	and investor-owned companies whose structure of governance and regulatory control
13	varies; and
14	WHEREAS, Kentucky's water infrastructure is extensive, and the average age of
15	Kentucky's water systems often exceeds the system's design life; and
16	WHEREAS, Kentucky has made significant progress to preserve and improve
17	access to potable water and adequate wastewater services through regionalization and
18	consolidation of water and wastewater systems; and
19	WHEREAS, the challenges for Kentucky's water and wastewater infrastructure are
20	system age; ongoing use of deferred maintenance; insufficient planning and infrastructure
21	investment; and a lack of technical, managerial and financial capacity, all of which have
22	resulted in water infrastructure failures; and
23	WHEREAS, absent preventive measures and some level of intervention, a failing
24	community public drinking water system is likely to become insolvent and put the
25	citizens of the Commonwealth in jeopardy of not having potable water; and
26	WHEREAS, the General Assembly should determine when and how to prevent the
27	failure of community water and wastewater systems and should empower the proper

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1 authorities to ensure appropriate oversight, effective enforcement measures, and strong, 2 capable governance of these systems; and 3 WHEREAS, the Legislative Research Commission authorized the Public Water and 4 Wastewater System Infrastructure Task Force by memorandum dated May 9, 2019, for 5 the 2019 Interim and again by memorandum June 5, 2020, for the 2020 Interim to address 6 the topics identified herein; and 7 WHEREAS, at the conclusion of the 2020 Interim, the membership of the task force 8 recommended that its work be continued by receiving reports, recommendations, and 9 legislative proposals from a stakeholder working group in the Energy and Environment 10 Cabinet; 11 NOW, THEREFORE, 12 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of 13 Kentucky, the House of Representatives concurring therein: 14 \rightarrow Section 1. The Legislative Research Commission is hereby directed to

reestablish the Public Water and Wastewater System Infrastructure Task Force to continue to evaluate policy options and to receive reports from the working group established in the Energy and Environment Cabinet.

18 → Section 2. The task force shall have the following members, with the final
19 membership of the task force being subject to the consideration and approval of the
20 Legislative Research Commission:

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(1) Two members of the House of Representatives chosen by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of whom shall be designated as co-chair;

23 (2) One member of the House of Representatives chosen by the House Minority
24 Floor Leader;

25 (3) Two members of the Senate chosen by the President of the Senate, one of
26 whom shall be designated as co-chair;

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(4) One member of the Senate chosen by the Senate Minority Floor Leader;

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1 The executive director of the Kentucky League of Cities, or designee; (5) 2 (6) The executive director of the Kentucky Council of Area Development 3 Districts, or designee; 4 (7)The director of the Division of Water within the Energy and Environment 5 Cabinet, or designee; 6 (8) The president of Kentucky American Water, or designee; 7 The executive director of the Kentucky County Judge/Executive Association, (9) 8 or designee; 9 (10) The director of the Kentucky Infrastructure Authority, or designee; 10 (11) The executive director of the Kentucky Municipal Utilities Association, or 11 designee; 12 (12) The executive director of the Kentucky Rural Water Association, or designee; 13 and 14 (13) The executive director of the Kentucky Office of Homeland Security, or 15 designee. 16 → Section 3. The task force shall meet at least three times during the 2021 Interim 17 and shall submit its findings, legislative recommendations, or a memorandum to the 18 Legislative Research Commission by November 30, 2021. If legislative recommendations 19 are submitted, the Legislative Research Commission may refer the recommendations to the appropriate committee or committees of jurisdiction in advance of the 2022 Regular 20 21 Session of the Kentucky General Assembly. 22 \rightarrow Section 4. Provisions of this Resolution to the contrary notwithstanding, the 23 Legislative Research Commission shall have the authority to alternatively assign the 24 issues identified herein to an interim joint committee or subcommittee thereof and to 25 designate a study completion date.

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
