1	A RESOLUTION declaring September 27, 2021, as Hereditary Cancer Awareness
2	Day.
3	WHEREAS, inherited genetic mutations play a major role in about 5 to 10 percent
4	of all cancers; and
5	WHEREAS, researchers have associated mutations in specific genes with more than
6	50 hereditary cancer syndromes that may predispose individuals to developing certain
7	cancers; and
8	WHEREAS, colon cancer can be due to inherited conditions such as Attenuated
9	Familial Adenomatous Polyposis, Cowden Syndrome, Familial Adenomatous Polyposis,
10	Hereditary Mixed Polyposis Syndrome, Juvenile Polyposis Syndrome, Lynch Syndrome,
11	MYH-Associated Polyposis, Peutz-Jeghers Syndrome, and Serrated Polyposis Syndrome;
12	and
13	WHEREAS, 1 in 200 people are born with a hereditary colon cancer syndrome and
14	10 percent of all colon cancer cases, or nearly 14,000 cases in 2019, are due to a
15	hereditary colon cancer syndrome; and
16	WHEREAS, 1 in 370 people are born with Lynch syndrome, which is a hereditary
17	disorder that increases the risk of developing many types of cancer, including colorectal,
18	endometrial, ovarian, stomach, hepatobiliary tract, urinary tract, skin, and brain cancer;
19	and
20	WHEREAS, hereditary syndromes may be passed from biological parents to their
21	offspring; and
22	WHEREAS, timely diagnosis followed with the development of a quality care plan,
23	including proper screening and treatment by an expert care team improves the likelihood
24	of a long life and increases the quality of life of affected individuals; and
25	WHEREAS, every person should know his or her family history or learn his or her
26	family history and share that history with a physician to determine if he or she may be at
27	high risk for hereditary cancers; and

WHEREAS, a positive genetic test will determine if these cancers are hereditary,

- 2 and if they will qualify affected individuals for regular cancer screening tests so that
- 3 growths, polyps, and tumors may be detected early and treated or removed before
- 4 becoming fatal; and
- 5 WHEREAS, it is indispensable to educate the world about these diseases in
- 6 remembrance of the many men and women who have lost their lives or are fighting for
- 7 their lives due to a lack of awareness; and
- 8 WHEREAS, it behooves each of us: men, women, parents, siblings, educators,
- 9 physicians, and citizens to promote awareness of these diseases and increase the chances
- 10 of saving lives;
- 11 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 12 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 13 Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The Senate hereby declares September 27, 2021, as Hereditary
- 15 Cancer Awareness Day.
- → Section 2. The Senate recognizes the need to raise awareness of these diseases
- and increase the chances of saving lives.
