1	A RESOLUTION honoring the memory of Senator Georgia Davis Powers and her
2	contributions to women's history.
3	WHEREAS, Kentucky women of every race, class, and ethnic background have
4	made historic contributions to the growth and strength of our Commonwealth in countless
5	recorded and unrecorded ways; and
6	WHEREAS, women of every race, class, and ethnic background served as early
7	leaders in the forefront of every major progressive social change movement; and
8	WHEREAS, March is Women's History Month, and during this month we celebrate
9	women who have been leaders not only in securing the rights of suffrage and equal
10	opportunity, but also in the abolitionist movement, the emancipation movement, the
11	industrial labor movement, the civil rights movement, and other movements which create
12	a more fair and just society for all; and
13	WHEREAS, despite these contributions, women in history have been consistently
14	overlooked and undervalued in the literature, teaching, and study of American history;
15	and
16	WHEREAS, today we recognize the historical contributions and achievements of
17	women at every opportunity; and
18	WHEREAS, a Kentucky native, Senator Georgia Davis Powers was the first woman
19	and the first person of color elected to the Senate, and served from January 1968, to
20	January 1989, when she chose to retire; and
21	WHEREAS, Senator Powers served as chair of the Health and Welfare Committee
22	from 1970 to 1976 and the Labor and Industry Committee from 1978 to 1988; and
23	WHEREAS, during her tenure, Senator Powers was "regarded as the leading
24	advocate for blacks, women, children, the poor, and the handicapped"; and
25	WHEREAS, Senator Powers sponsored bills prohibiting employment, sex, and age
26	discrimination, requiring an increase to the minimum wage, as well as statewide fair
27	housing legislation; and

WHEREAS, Senator Powers was a leader of national significance in advocacy for

- women's and civil rights; and
- WHEREAS, Senator Powers received an honorary doctor of laws degree from the
- 4 University of Kentucky and an honorary doctorate of humane letters from the University
- 5 of Louisville; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Senator Powers passed from this earth on January 30, 2016, at the age
- 7 of 92;
- 8 NOW, THEREFORE,
- 9 Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 10 Kentucky:
- → Section 1. The Senate honors Senator Georgia Davis Powers for her
- 12 contributions to the history of women, people of color, and all Kentuckians.
- → Section 2. The Senate honors the recorded and unrecorded contributions of all
- women to the prosperity and character of the Commonwealth.
- → Section 3. The Senate encourages all Kentuckians to explore the history of
- 16 Kentucky women and to honor Kentucky women who are making great contributions to
- 17 the Commonwealth today.
