2	Kentucky.
3	WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases are the number one killer of women in the
4	United States; and
5	WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases kill one woman almost every 80 seconds in the
6	United States; and
7	WHEREAS, heart disease and stroke can affect all women at any age. Heart attacks
8	are on the rise in younger generations of women, and younger women are less likely to be
9	aware of knowing the warning signs of heart attacks and strokes; and
10	WHEREAS, cardiovascular diseases kill one in three women, but about 80 percent
11	of cardiac events can be prevented through education and lifestyle changes; and
12	WHEREAS, all women are encouraged to move more, eat smart, and manage blood
13	pressure to reduce their risk of cardiovascular disease; and
14	WHEREAS, the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women movement
15	motivates women to learn their family history and to meet with a healthcare provider to
16	determine their risk for cardiovascular diseases and stroke; and
17	WHEREAS, as the trusted, passionate, and relevant force for change to eradicate
18	heart disease and stroke in women, the American Heart Association's Go Red for Women
19	movement remains steadfast and committed to meeting the comprehensive health needs
20	of women at every life stage;
21	NOW, THEREFORE,
22	Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
23	Kentucky:
24	→Section 1. In recognition of the importance of the ongoing fight against heart
25	disease and stroke, this body hereby proclaims February 5, 2021, to be National Wear
26	Red Day in Kentucky, and urges all citizens to show their support for women and the
27	fight against heart disease by commemorating this day by wearing the color red. By
