1	A RESOLUTION designating April as Parkinson's Awareness Month.
2	WHEREAS, Parkinson's disease is a chronic, progressive neurological disease and
3	the second most common neurodegenerative disease in the United States; and
4	WHEREAS, although there is inadequate data on the incidence and prevalence of
5	Parkinson's disease, the disease is estimated to affect between 500,000 and 1,000,000
6	individuals in the United States, with that number expected to more than double by 2040;
7	and
8	WHEREAS, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention,
9	Parkinson's disease is the 14th leading cause of death in the United States; and
10	WHEREAS, millions of individuals in the United States are greatly impacted by
11	Parkinson's disease, including the caregivers, family members, and friends of individuals
12	living with Parkinson's disease; and
13	WHEREAS, research suggests that the cause of Parkinson's disease is a
14	combination of genetic and environmental factors, but the exact cause of the disease in
15	most individuals is still unknown; and
16	WHEREAS, as of January 2021, there is no objective test or biomarker with which
17	to diagnose Parkinson's disease; and
18	WHEREAS, there is no known cure or drug to slow or halt the progression of
19	Parkinson's disease, and available treatments are limited in their ability to address the
20	medical needs of patients and remain effective over time; and
21	WHEREAS, the symptoms of Parkinson's disease vary from person to person and
22	may include tremors, slowness of movement and rigidity, problems with gait and balance,
23	disturbances in speech and swallowing, cognitive impairment and dementia, mood
24	disorders, and a variety of other nonmotor symptoms; and
25	WHEREAS, volunteers, researchers, caregivers, and medical professionals are
26	working to improve the quality of life of individuals living with Parkinson's disease and
27	the families of those individuals; and

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1 WHEREAS, increased research, education, and community support services are 2 needed to find more effective treatments and to provide access to quality care to 3 individuals living with Parkinson's disease; 4 NOW, THEREFORE, Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of 5 6 Kentucky: 7 \rightarrow Section 1. The Senate hereby designates April as "Parkinson's Awareness 8 Month." 9 \rightarrow Section 2. The Senate hereby supports the goals and ideals of Parkinson's 10 Awareness Month. 11 \rightarrow Section 3. The Senate hereby supports research to find better treatments and a 12 cure for Parkinson's disease. 13 → Section 4. The Senate hereby recognizes the individuals living with Parkinson's 14 disease who participate in vital clinical trials to advance the knowledge of the disease. 15 \rightarrow Section 5. The Senate hereby commends the dedication of the organizations, 16 volunteers, researchers, and millions of individuals across the United States who are 17 working to improve the quality of life of individuals living with Parkinson's disease and 18 the families of those individuals. 19 \rightarrow Section 6. The Clerk of the Senate is directed to transmit a copy of this 20 Resolution to Senator Mike Wilson.

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
