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1	AN ACT relating to the establishment of the Kentucky Early Entry Initiative pilot
2	program and declaring an emergency.
3	Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
4	→SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 161 IS CREATED TO
5	READ AS FOLLOWS:
6	(1) As used in this section:
7	(a) "Early career teacher" means a Kentucky public school teacher with zero
8	(0) to three (3) years of experience teaching grades one (1) through three (3)
9	in the areas of English, reading, language arts, or mathematics; and
10	(b) "National board" means the National Board for Professional Teaching
11	<u>Standards.</u>
12	(2) The General Assembly does hereby establish the Kentucky Early Entry Initiative
13	pilot program to begin with the 2022-2023 school year and continue until the end
14	of the 2024-2025 school year. The pilot program shall be administered by the
15	Kentucky Department of Education to:
16	(a) Give Kentucky public school teachers the opportunity to begin the process
17	of certification by the National Board for Professional Teaching Standards
18	within their first three (3) years in the classroom and to achieve certification
19	early in their careers;
20	(b) Create awareness of national board certification specifically among early
21	career teachers, teachers of color, and teachers in high-need schools and
22	rural schools through awareness campaigns;
23	(c) Increase the number of teachers earning national board certification in the
24	state; and
25	(d) Embed national board certification as an assumed and achievable part of
26	the professional pathway for all teachers.
27	(3) The Kentucky Early Entry Initiative pilot program shall pursue a comprehensive

19	4. Conduct ongoing implementation evaluation;
20	(c) Beginning with the 2023-2024 school year:
21	1. Continue the professional learning and candidacy of the first cohort
22	of teachers as they develop and submit the national board's
23	Component 4 and the Component 1 assessment;
24	2. Oversee the second cohort of teachers throughout the year as they
25	begin professional learning, engage with the national board standards
26	and resources, and reflect on their practice, culminating in the
27	completion of the national board's Components 2 and 3;

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1	3. Promote and encourage the ongoing use of resources by
2	postsecondary institutions and educator preparation programs; and
3	4. Conduct ongoing implementation evaluation; and
4	(d) Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year:
5	1. Continue the professional learning and candidacy of the second
6	cohort of teachers as they develop and submit the national board's
7	Component 4 and the Component 1 assessment;
8	2. Promote and encourage the ongoing use of resources by
9	postsecondary institutions and educator preparation programs;
10	3. Conduct summative research and evaluation; and
11	4. Submit a report to the Legislative Research Commission by December
12	<u>1, 2025, that includes:</u>
13	a. An evaluation of the implementation of the pilot components;
14	b. An evaluation of the impact of the pilot program on objectives
