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1 AN ACT relating to military affairs.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

- 3 → Section 1. KRS 36.474 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 During active duty of a regular member of the United States Armed Forces
- 5 deployed outside the United States who names Kentucky as home of record for
- 6 military purposes, or any [federal active duty of a]member of a state National
- 7 Guard or a Reserve component \(\frac{1}{2} \) who names Kentucky as home of record for

- 17 An application for a trust fund grant may be filed by the member who names (2)
- 18 Kentucky as home of record for military purposes or his or her Kentucky resident
- 19 spouse. The application shall be accompanied by an appropriate authorization to
- 20 access personnel information contained in the military database Defense Enrollment
- 21 Reporting System (DEERS) for verification purposes.
- 22 Subject to the availability of trust fund moneys, the adjutant general shall award a (3)
- 23 grant to an applicant described in paragraphs (a) to (c) of subsection (1) of this
- 24 section if that person's application is need-based, and the amount of the grant does
- 25 not exceed the dollar cap established by the board through the promulgation of
- administrative regulations under KRS Chapter 13A. An application shall be need-26

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1 person may receive in grants per twelve (12) month period.
