9	<u>(3)</u> [(2)]	"Casket" means a rigid container which is designed for the encasement of	
10	hum	an remains constructed of wood, metal, or other material.	
11	<u>(4)[(3)]</u>	"Closed container" means a sealed container or urn in which cremated remains	
12	are	placed and enclosed in a manner that prevents leakage or spillage of cremated	
13	rema	ains or the entrance of foreign material.	
14	<u>(5)</u> [(4)]	"Cremated remains" means the fragments remaining after the cremation	
15	proc	ess has been completed.	
16	<u>(6)</u> [(5)]	"Cremation" means the [heating ]process that reduces human remains to bone

18	<u>(a)</u>	Combustion and evaporation; or	
19	<u>(b)</u>	Alkaline hydrolysis.	
20	<u>(7)</u> [(6)]	"Cremation authorization form" means a form promulgated by administrative	
21	regu	lation of the Attorney General that expresses consent to the decedent's	
22	cren	nation. The form shall include information concerning the parties' rights and	
23	resp	onsibilities.	
24	<u>(8)</u> [(7)]	"Cremation chamber" means an enclosed space designed and manufactured	
25	for t	he purpose of cremating human remains.	
26	<u>(9)</u> [(8)]	"Cremation container" means a container in which human remains may be	
27	deliv	vered to a crematory for cremation that is:	

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1	(a) Rigid enough to support the weight of the corpse, closed, and leakproof;
2	(b) [Composed of a combustible material or other material approved by the
3	crematory authority; and
4	(c) ]A proper and dignified covering for the human remains: and

6	1. A combustible material or other material approved by the crematory
7	authority for combustion cremation; or
8	2. A biodegradable material or other material approved by the crematory
9	authority for alkaline hydrolysis cremation.
10	<u>10)</u> [(9)] "Crematory authority" means the legal entity which is licensed by the Attorney
11	General to operate a crematory and conduct cremations. Crematory authority does
12	not include state university health science centers.
13	<u><math>(10)</math></u> "Crematory" means a fixed building or structure that contains one (1) or more
14	cremation chambers for the reduction of bodies of deceased persons to cremated
15	remains. "Crematory" includes crematorium.
16	<u>12)</u> [(11)] "Crematory operator" means the person in charge of a licensed crematory
17	authority.
18	<u>13)</u> [(12)] "Declaration" has the same meaning as in KRS 367.93101.
19	<u>14)</u> [(13)] "Holding facility" means an area designated for the retention of human
20	remains prior to cremation.
21	<u>15)</u> [(14)] "Human remains" means the body of a deceased person or part of a body or
22	limb that has been removed from a living person, in any state of decomposition,
23	prior to cremation.
24	<u>16)</u> [(15)] "Pathological waste" means human tissues, organs, and blood or body fluids,
25	in liquid or semiliquid form that are removed from a person for medical purposes.
26	"Pathological waste" does not include amputations.
27	<u>17)</u> [(16)] "Processed remains" means the end result of pulverization, by which the

3	(18) [(17)] "Retort operator" means a person operating a cremation characteristic equation (18)	amber.

6	which have been removed from their container can be mixed w	ith or placed on top
7	of the soil or ground cover.	
8	(20) [(19)] "Temporary container" means a receptacle for cremated ren	nains, usually made
9	of plastic, cardboard, ceramics, plastic film, wood, or metal, des	igned to prevent the
10	leakage of processed remains or the entrance of foreign materi	als which will hold
11	the cremated remains until an urn or other permanent container i	s acquired.
12	Section 2. KRS 367.97514 is amended to read as follows:	
13	(1) The simultaneous cremation of the remains of more than one (	1) individual within
14	the same cremation chamber is specifically declared unlaw	ful. The fact that
15	incidental and unavoidable residue remains in the cremation	chamber or other
16	equipment or any container used in a prior cremation is not	a violation of this
17	section.	
18	(2) No human remains delivered to a crematory shall be removed	from the cremation
19	container, and the cremation container shall be cremated with	the human remains.
20	The identification from the outside of the cremation container sh	all be removed and

22 the cremation process is complete.

(3) A body shall not be cremated with a pacemaker or other potentially hazardous
implant, including any toxic or explosive-type sealed implants, in place. If the
authorizing agent is the decedent, the declarant shall disclose the existence of any
pacemaker or other hazardous implants to the crematory authority, or in the event
there is no declaration, then the next class of authorizing agent in the order set forth

1		in KRS <u>367.93117</u> [367.97501(1)] shall be responsible for disclosing the existence
2		of any pacemaker or other hazardous implants to the crematory authority.
3	(4)	No crematory authority or any person employed by or acting on behalf of a
4		crematory authority shall remove or possess dental gold or dental silver from any
5		human remains. The fact that there is incidental and unavoidable dental gold or
6		dental silver remains in the cremation chamber, in other equipment, or in any
7		container used in a prior cremation is not a violation of this section.
8	(5)	The crematory or crematorium shall be secure from access by unauthorized persons.
9	(6)	The crematory retort operator shall have at least forty eight (48) hours of on the job
10		training supervised by the crematory operator, with verification of this training
11		having been filed with the Attorney General.

13	As u	used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise:
14	(1)	"Apprentice" means a person engaged in learning the practice of embalming or
15		funeral directing who is under the instruction and personal supervision of a
16		Kentucky-licensed embalmer or a Kentucky-licensed funeral director;
17	(2)	"Board" means the Kentucky Board of Embalmers and Funeral Directors;
18	(3)	"Direct burial" means the pick-up, transport, and interment of a dead human body or
19		body parts without a funeral;
20	(4)	"Embalmer" means a person who preserves, restores, and disinfects dead human
21		bodies by the application of chemical substances either externally or internally, or
22		both;
23	(5)	"Embalming service establishment" means a place of business where dead human
24		bodies are embalmed or otherwise prepared or held for burial. An embalming
25		service establishment shall not arrange or conduct a funeral or direct burial. An
26		embalming service establishment may arrange for and transport dead human bodies
27		only under the following circumstances:

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1		(a) On behalf of a full-service funeral establishment;
2		(b) On behalf of a visitation and ceremonial funeral establishment; or
3		(c) At the direction of a coroner;

6	(7)	"Full-service funeral establishment" means a place of business where dead human
7		bodies may be embalmed or otherwise prepared and held for burial and where
8		funeral services may be arranged, provided, and conducted;
9	(8)	"Funeral director" means a person who, for profit, engages in or represents himself
10		or herself as engaged in the supervision, direction, and arrangement of funeral
11		services, transportation, burials, and disposals of dead human bodies;
12	(9)	"Funeral establishment" or "establishment" means:
13		(a) A full-service funeral establishment;
14		(b) An embalming service establishment; or
15		(c) A visitation and ceremonial funeral service establishment;
16	(10)	"Memorial service" means a ceremony or service held in honor of a deceased
17		human being at which there are no human remains, as defined in KRS
18		367.97501[(14)] present, and for which no license is required;
19	(11)	"Person," as used in this chapter, includes but is not limited to an individual,

21	(12)	"In use" means that funeral directing or embalming is taking place in a funeral

23	(13)	"Courtesy card" means a card that is issued by the board to a funeral director or an
24		embalmer from another state that gives the director or embalmer permission to
25		receive and transport a dead human body to and from Kentucky for a funeral and to
26		conduct funeral services and burials in Kentucky;
27	(14)	"Supervision" means responsibility for the professional activities of the funeral
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1 establishment that requires a Kentucky-licensed funeral director or a Kentucky-2 licensed embalmer, as appropriate, to be on the premises when the funeral 3 establishment is in use. If the Kentucky-licensed funeral director or the Kentucky-4 licensed embalmer is unable to be on the premises due to a reasonable circumstance, then the Kentucky-licensed funeral director or the Kentucky-licensed 5 6 embalmer shall be within a reasonable proximity to the funeral establishment so that 7 upon contact the funeral director or embalmer is able to immediately return to the 8 funeral establishment; and

9 (15) "Visitation and ceremonial funeral service establishment" means a location from 10 which a funeral establishment may provide all services except embalming within 11 either the same or adjoining county as that served by an affiliated full-service 12 funeral establishment. The visitation and ceremonial funeral service establishment 13 shall be owned in whole or in part by the affiliated full-service funeral 14 establishment, and shall be located sufficiently close to the full-service funeral 15 establishment to share administration and services in a manner that renders it 16 unnecessary for the visitation and ceremonial funeral service establishment to 17 independently meet the minimum licensure requirements for a full-service funeral establishment. A full-service funeral establishment may own and operate more than 18 19 one (1) visitation and ceremonial funeral service establishment.
