

1 AN ACT relating to regional service areas for mental health or individuals with an  
2 intellectual disability.

3 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

4 ➔Section 1. KRS 210.370 is amended to read as follows:

5 *(1) The following fifteen (15) regional service areas for mental health or individuals*  
6 *with an intellectual disability are hereby created and established:*

7 *(a) Regional service area one (1), which shall include the counties of Ballard,*  
8 *Carlisle, Hickman, Fulton, McCracken, Graves, Marshall, Livingston, and*  
9 *Calloway;*

10 *(b) Regional service area two (2), which shall include the counties of*  
11 *Crittenden, Lyon, Caldwell, Hopkins, Muhlenberg, Trigg, Christian, and*  
12 *Todd;*

13 *(c) Regional service area three (3), which shall include the counties of Union,*  
14 *Henderson, Webster, McLean, Daviess, Ohio, and Hancock;*

15 *(d) Regional service area four (4), which shall include the counties of Logan,*  
16 *Simpson, Butler, Warren, Edmonson, Hart, Barren, Allen, Metcalfe, and*  
17 *Monroe;*

18 *(e) Regional service area five (5), which shall include the counties of*  
19 *Breckinridge, Meade, Grayson, Hardin, Larue, Nelson, Washington, and*  
20 *Marion;*

21 *(f) Regional service area six (6), which shall include the counties of Bullitt,*  
22 *Henry, Jefferson, Oldham, Shelby, Spencer, and Trimble;*

23 *(g) Regional service area seven (7), which shall include the counties of Boone,*  
24 *Kenton, Campbell, Carroll, Gallatin, Owen, Grant, and Pendleton;*

25 *(h) Regional service area eight (8), which shall include the counties of*  
26 *Bracken, Mason, Robertson, Fleming, and Lewis;*

27 *(i) Regional service area nine (9), which shall include the counties of Rowan,*

- 1           *Bath, Montgomery, Menifee, and Morgan;*
- 2           *(j) Regional service area ten (10), which shall include the counties of Greenup,*
- 3           *Boyd, Carter, Elliott, and Lawrence;*
- 4           *(k) Regional service area eleven (11), which shall include the counties of*
- 5           *Johnson, Magoffin, Martin, Floyd, and Pike;*
- 6           *(l) Regional service area twelve (12), which shall include the counties of Wolfe,*
- 7           *Owsley, Lee, Breathitt, Leslie, Perry, Knott, and Letcher;*
- 8           *(m) Regional service area thirteen (13), which shall include the counties of*
- 9           *Jackson, Rockcastle, Laurel, Clay, Knox, Whitley, Bell, and Harlan;*
- 10          *(n) Regional service area fourteen (14), which shall include the counties of*
- 11          *Taylor, Adair, Green, Casey, Russell, Pulaski, Clinton, Cumberland,*
- 12          *Wayne, and McCreary; and*
- 13          *(o) Regional service area fifteen (15), which shall include the counties of*
- 14          *Anderson, Franklin, Woodford, Mercer, Boyle, Lincoln, Garrard,*
- 15          *Jessamine, Fayette, Scott, Harrison, Bourbon, Nicholas, Clark, Madison,*
- 16          *Powell, and Estill.*

17 *(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section,* any combination of cities or  
 18 counties of over fifty thousand (50,000) population, and upon the consent of the  
 19 secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services, any combination of cities  
 20 or counties with less than fifty thousand (50,000) population, may establish a  
 21 regional community services program for mental health or individuals with an  
 22 intellectual disability and staff same with persons specially trained in psychiatry and  
 23 related fields. Such programs and clinics may be administered by a community  
 24 board for mental health or individuals with an intellectual disability established  
 25 pursuant to KRS 210.370 to 210.460, or by a nonprofit corporation.

26 ➔Section 2. KRS 210.380 is amended to read as follows:

- 27 *(1) Each regional service area established in Section 1 of this Act or any*~~Every~~

1 combination of cities and counties establishing a regional community services  
2 program for mental health or individuals with an intellectual disability shall, before  
3 it comes within the provisions of KRS 210.370 to 210.460, establish a community  
4 board for mental health or individuals with an intellectual disability consisting of at  
5 least nine (9) members. When a nonprofit corporation is the administrator of such a  
6 program not established by a combination of either cities or counties, such  
7 corporation shall select a community board for mental health or individuals with an  
8 intellectual disability which shall be representative of the groups herein enumerated,  
9 but the number of members need not be nine (9). When any combination of cities  
10 and counties establishes a regional community services program for mental health  
11 or individuals with an intellectual disability, the chief executive officer of each  
12 participating city or county shall appoint two (2) members to a selecting committee  
13 which shall select the members of the board. Membership of the community boards  
14 for mental health or individuals with an intellectual disability shall be representative  
15 of the elected chief executives of county governments, local health departments,  
16 medical societies, county welfare boards, hospital boards, lay associations  
17 concerned with mental health and intellectual disabilities as well as labor, business  
18 and civic groups, and the general public.

19 **(2) No community board for mental health or individuals with an intellectual**  
20 **disability, whether established directly by the counties of a regional service area,**  
21 **any other combination of cities and counties, or a nonprofit corporation**  
22 **designated to administer a regional community services program, shall provide**  
23 **services outside of its regional service area as established in Section 1 of this Act**  
24 **or outside of the jurisdiction of the cities and counties that have combined to**  
25 **form the regional community services program for mental health or individuals**  
26 **with an intellectual disability, unless:**

27 **(a) It is licensed by the Cabinet for Health and Family Services as a behavioral**

- 1           *health services organization;*  
 2           *(b) It has obtained written approval form the Cabinet for Health and Family*  
 3           *Services to provide services as a behavioral health services organization*  
 4           *outside of its regional service area or jurisdiction of the cities and counties*  
 5           *that have combined to form the regional community services program; and*  
 6           *(c) It complies with administrative regulations promulgated by the Cabinet for*  
 7           *Health and Family Services related to behavioral health services*  
 8           *organizations when providing services outside of its regional service area or*  
 9           *jurisdiction or the jurisdiction of the cities and counties that have combined*  
 10           *to form the regional community services program.*

11           ➔Section 3. KRS 210.410 is amended to read as follows:

- 12           (1) The secretary of the Cabinet for Health and Family Services is hereby authorized to  
 13           make state grants and other fund allocations from the Cabinet for Health and Family  
 14           Services to assist any *regional service area established in Section 1 of this Act,*  
 15           *any* combination of cities and counties, or nonprofit corporations in the  
 16           establishment and operation of regional community mental health and intellectual  
 17           disability programs which may provide primary care services and shall provide at  
 18           least the following services:  
 19           (a) Inpatient services;  
 20           (b) Outpatient services;  
 21           (c) Partial hospitalization or psychosocial rehabilitation services;  
 22           (d) Emergency services;  
 23           (e) Consultation and education services; and  
 24           (f) Services for individuals with an intellectual disability.
- 25           (2) The services required in subsection (1)(a), (b), (c), (d), and (e) of this section, in  
 26           addition to primary care services, if provided, shall be available to the mentally ill,  
 27           drug abusers and alcohol abusers, and all age groups including children and the

1 elderly. The services required in subsection (1)(a), (b), (c), (d), (e), and (f), in  
2 addition to primary care services, if provided, shall be available to individuals with  
3 an intellectual disability. The services required in subsection (1)(b) of this section  
4 shall be available to any child age sixteen (16) or older upon request of such child  
5 without the consent of a parent or legal guardian, if the matter for which the  
6 services are sought involves alleged physical or sexual abuse by a parent or  
7 guardian whose consent would otherwise be required.
