1		AN ACT relating to school fiscal impact statements.
2	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 6 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	No bill or resolution which relates to any aspect of the common schools or any
6		service provided thereby and causes a common school to incur a cost shall be
7		voted on by a standing committee of either chamber of the General Assembly
8		unless a school fiscal impact statement has been prepared and attached to the bill
9		pursuant to subsection (2) of this section.
10	<u>(2)</u>	The director of the Legislative Research Commission shall have the school fiscal
11		impact statement prepared by the Legislative Research Commission or by other
12		departments or agencies of state government for any bill or resolution introduced
13		before the General Assembly which relates to any aspect of the common schools
14		or any service provided thereby and causes a common school to incur a cost.
15		Departments or agencies of state government so requested by the director shall
16		comply with the request within seven (7) working days of receipt. The school
17		fiscal impact statement shall be filed with the clerk in the chamber of the General
18		Assembly in which the bill was introduced and attached to each copy of the bill.
19	<u>(3)</u>	The Legislative Research Commission may submit to any other departments or
20		agencies of state government, any part of the common school system, or any
21		entity that officially represents parts of the common school system any request for
22		information concerning local fiscal management and fiscal conditions. Each
23		recipient shall be required to comply with such requests within seven (7) working
24		days.
25	<u>(4)</u>	A school fiscal impact statement shall state whether the bill or resolution is
26		determined to be a mandate. Such determination shall be made by the director of
27		the Legislative Research Commission, except as provided by subsection (5) of this

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section. If the bill or order is a state mandate, the note shall contain an estimate

2	of the effect the law will have on expenditures or revenues of local government
3	for the first full fiscal year the law is to be in effect.
4	(5) The director, at his or her discretion, may seek a certification from the Attorney
5	General on the question of whether a bill or resolution constitutes a state
6	mandate. The Attorney General shall, within seven (7) working days from receipt
7	of the request, certify to the director that the bill or resolution is or is not a state
8	mandate.
9	(6) If any bill or resolution is amended after the preparation of the school fiscal
10	impact statement, it shall be resubmitted to the person responsible for preparation
11	of the note, who shall reevaluate the bill or resolution as amended and change
12	the statement in accordance with the amendment.
13	(7) Copies of the school fiscal impact statement shall be furnished by the Legislative
14	Research Commission to any school official upon written request.
15	(8) The director of the Legislative Research Commission shall establish policies and
16	procedures to ensure the accurate and timely production of school fiscal impact
17	statements, including but not limited to:
18	(a) Establishing a system for collecting, compiling, and analyzing fiscal and
19	other information from the common school system;
20	(b) Delegating responsibilities for aspects of the school fiscal impact statements
21	to the various subdivisions of the Legislative Research Commission; and
22	(c) Establishing the format and design of the statements.
23	→ Section 2. Section 1 of this Act shall go into effect on January 1, 2024, with the
24	intent that it be operational for the 2024 Regular Session of the General Assembly. The
25	Legislative Research Commission shall develop and refine the policies and procedures
26	necessary for implementation during the 2023 Regular Session.
