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1		AN ACT relating to freestanding birthing centers.
2	Be it	enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 216B IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	As used in this section, "freestanding birthing center" means any health facility,
6		place, or institution that is not a hospital, is not in a hospital or a private
7		residence, and is established to provide care for labor, delivery, and the
8		immediate postpartum period.
9	<u>(2)</u>	Notwithstanding any other provision of the law to the contrary, a freestanding
10		birthing center applying for a certificate of need:
11		(a) In a medically underserved area as determined by the United States
12		Department of Health and Human Services shall have satisfied the need
13		requirement. A certificate of need shall not be denied to such centers based
14		on need; and
15		(b) In a non-medically underserved area shall satisfy the need requirement if it
16		demonstrates that there is sufficient need in the area for freestanding
17		birthing center services to allow its financial viability over time.
18	<u>(3)</u>	The cabinet shall promulgate administrative regulations establishing licensure
19		standards for freestanding birthing centers by December 1, 2022. The
20		administrative regulations shall:
21		(a) Require accreditation by the Commission for the Accreditation of Birth
22		Centers; and
23		(b) Be consistent with the American Association of Birth Centers (AABC)
24		Standards for Birth Centers.
25	<u>(4)</u>	Nothing in this section is intended to expand or limit liability of a health care
26		provider or a freestanding birthing center. In the event of an action for injury or
27		death due to any act or omission of a health care provider rendering services at a

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freestanding birthing center where an injured patient is transferred to any other
health care provider or health care facility, the liability of the subsequent health
care provider or health care facility shall be limited to their own negligent acts
and omissions that violate their professional standards of care, unless the
subsequent health care provider or health care facility owns, operates, or
provided care at the freestanding birthing center, and under those circumstances
the health care provider or health care facility shall be liable for acts or
omissions that violate their professional standards of care and that occur at a
freestanding birthing center that the health care provider or health care facility
owns or operates.
