1		AN ACT relating to jurors.
2	Be it	enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ Section 1. KRS 29A.100 is amended to read as follows:
4	(1)	Upon the request of a prospective juror prior to assignment to a trial court, the Chief
5		Circuit Judge, or after the juror's assignment to a trial court, the trial judge may
6		excuse such juror upon a showing of:
7		(a) Undue hardship: [,]
8		(b) Extreme inconvenience: $[,]$ or
9		(c) Public necessity.
10	<u>(2)</u>	On the day on which the prospective jurors are <u>summoned</u> [summonsed] to appear,
11		any person not previously excused who desires to be excused shall be heard.
12	<u>(3)</u> [(2)] The Chief Circuit Judge may designate and authorize one (1) or more judges
13		of the court, the court's clerk, a deputy clerk, the court's administrator, or a deputy
14		court administrator to excuse a juror from service for a period not to exceed ten (10)
15		days or to postpone jury service for a period not to exceed twelve (12) months. The
16		reasons for excuse or postponement shall be entered in the space provided on the
17		juror qualification form.
18	<u>(4)</u> [(3)] In his or her discretion the judge may excuse a juror from service entirely,
19		reduce the number of days of service, or may postpone the juror's service
20		temporarily for a period of time not to exceed, however, twenty-four (24) months.
21		Whenever possible the judge shall favor temporary postponement of service or
22		reduced service over permanent excuse. When excusing a juror, the judge shall
23		record the juror's name, as provided in KRS 29A.080, and the reasons for granting
24		the excuse.
25	(5) [(4)] The judge shall excuse <i>from jury duty:</i>

2		(b) A person who is seventy-five (75) years of age or older upon his or her
3		<u>request.</u>
4	<u>(6)</u>	Any person excused under subsection (5)(b) of this section may request that this
5		excuse be permanent and may subsequently request, in writing, to be included in
6		future jury lists provided he or she meets the qualifications required by this
7		chapter.
