AN ACT relating to licensed occupations.

- 2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
 - Section 1. KRS 317.420 is amended to read as follows:
- 4 (1) No person shall engage in the practice of "barbering" for other than cosmetic
 5 purposes nor shall any person engage in barbering for the treatment of physical or
 6 mental ailments, except that the provisions of this chapter shall not apply to:
- 7 (a) Persons authorized by the law of this state to practice medicine, chiropody,
 8 optometry, dentistry, chiropractic, nursing, or embalming when incidental
 9 practices of barbering are performed by them in the normal course of the
 10 practice of their profession;
- (b) Commissioned medical or surgical personnel of the United States Armed
 Forces performing incidental practices of barbering in the course of their
 duties; or
- 14 (c) Barbering services performed at an institution operated by or under contract to
 15 the Department of Corrections or the Department of Juvenile Justice.
- 16 (2) Except as provided in subsection (1) of this section, no person shall engage in the
 17 practice of barbering for the public generally or for consideration without the
 18 appropriate license required by this chapter.
- 19 (3) No person, unless duly and properly licensed pursuant to this chapter, shall:
- 20 (a) Teach barbering;
- 21 (b) Operate a barber shop;
- 22 (c) Conduct or operate a school for barbers; or
- 23 (d) Lease or rent booth space as an independent contract owner.
- (4) No person shall aid or abet any person in violating the provisions of this section, nor
 shall any person engage or employ for consideration any person for the performance
 of any practice licensed by this chapter unless the person to perform such practice
 holds and displays the appropriate license therefor.
