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AN ACT relating to military affairs.

2 Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:

→ Section 1. KRS 36.474 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) During active duty of a regular member of the United States Armed Forces
5 deployed outside the United States who names Kentucky as home of record for
6 military purposes, or any [federal active duty of a]member of a state National
7 Guard or a Reserve component[,] who names Kentucky as home of record for
8 military purposes, and for one hundred eighty (180) days following the end of
9 deployment <u>under Title 10 or 32 of the United States Code or KRS 38.030[outside</u>
10 the United States or deactivation], as appropriate, trust fund moneys shall be used to

- 11 support:
- 12 (a) The person who names Kentucky as home of record for military purposes;
- 13 (b) The person's Kentucky resident spouse;

14 (c) The person's dependent or dependents; or

15 (d) A group of several members of the military or their families as described in
16 paragraphs (a) to (c) of this subsection.

17 (2) An application for a trust fund grant may be filed by the member who names
18 Kentucky as home of record for military purposes or his or her Kentucky resident
19 spouse. The application shall be accompanied by an appropriate authorization to
20 access personnel information contained in the military database Defense Enrollment
21 Reporting System (DEERS) for verification purposes.

(3) Subject to the availability of trust fund moneys, the adjutant general shall award a
grant to an applicant described in paragraphs (a) to (c) of subsection (1) of this
section if that person's application is need-based, and the amount of the grant does
not exceed the dollar cap established by the board through the promulgation of
administrative regulations *under KRS Chapter 13A*. An application shall be needbased if:

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1		(a)	Funds are requested for necessary expenses incurred, or to be incurred.
2			Necessary expenses shall include but not be limited to:
3			1. Housing;
4			2. Utilities;
5			3. Groceries;
6			4. Health insurance copay; and
7			5. Child care;
8		(b)	The necessary expenses created, or will create, an undue hardship on a person
9			referred to in subsection (1) of this section;
10		(c)	[The undue hardship is directly related to the member's deployment outside
11			the United States or federal active duty, as appropriate;

14		<u>(d)</u> [((e)] The military family assistance trust fund is the last resort.
15	(4)	Sub	ject to the availability of trust fund moneys, the adjutant general may expend
16		trust	t fund money, in amounts <i>not to exceed the dollar cap established by the board</i>

25	(5)	Sub	ject to the availability of trust fund moneys, the director of the Kentucky
26		Nati	onal Guard Family Services Program within the Kentucky Department of
27		Mili	tary Affairs may expend trust fund money, in amounts not to exceed the dollar

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1		cap established by the board through the promulgation of administrative
2		regulations under KRS Chapter 13A [up to one thousand dollars (\$1,000) per
3		situation and up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) per calendar year], to benefit
4		individuals described in subsection (1) of this section if:
5		(a) The individuals have a demonstrated need that affects their health, safety, or
6		well-being; and
7		(b) A majority of the members of the military family assistance trust fund board
8		has approved the expenditure, verbally or in writing.
9	(6)	Subject to the availability of military family assistance trust fund moneys, the
10		adjutant general shall expend trust fund money to eligible applicants to the
11		Kentucky National Guard Adoption Assistance Program as provided in KRS
12		36.477. Eligible applicants to the Kentucky National Guard Adoption Assistance
13		Program shall not be subject to the requirements of subsection (1) of this section.
14	(7)	(a) The adjutant general shall award or decline to award a grant within sixty (60)
15		days of receiving an application.
16		(b) If the adjutant general awards or declines to award a grant, he or she shall state
17		in writing the reason for the decision and keep the writing on file.
18		(c) If the adjutant general declines to award a grant, he or she shall provide the
19		applicant with a copy of the writing referred to in paragraph (b) of this
20		subsection. In addition, if the adjutant general declines to award a grant due to
21		the availability of public or private funds, the adjutant general shall identify
22		the source of available funds for the applicant and provide assistance with
23		regard to seeking funds from that source.
24	(8)	[No later than August 15, 2006,]The military family assistance trust fund board
25		shall promulgate [emergency]administrative regulations under KRS Chapter 13A
26		to carry out the provisions of this <u>Act</u> [section]. These [emergency]regulations shall,
27		at a minimum, enhance administrative efficiency and limit the dollar amount that a

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1 person may receive in grants per twelve (12) month period.
