1		AN ACT relating to employee right of action and declaring an emergency.
2	Be i	t enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:
3		→ SECTION 1. A NEW SECTION OF KRS CHAPTER 367 IS CREATED TO
4	REA	AD AS FOLLOWS:
5	<u>(1)</u>	For the purposes of this section:
6		(a) "Employee" means any person employed by or suffered or permitted to
7		work for a private or public employer for wages or other remuneration;
8		(b) "Private employer" means any person, either individual, corporation,
9		partnership, agency, or firm that employs at least one (1) employee; and
10		(c) "Public employer" means the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and any of its
11		cabinets, departments, bureaus, agencies, or political subdivisions.
12	<u>(2)</u>	Notwithstanding any provision of law to the contrary, an employee may bring a
13		claim against a private or public employer in a court of competent jurisdiction for
14		injuries caused by that employer if:
15		(a) That employer adopted a mandatory vaccination policy as a condition of
16		employment; and
17		(b) An employee received a vaccination and suffered an adverse reaction as a
18		<u>result.</u>
19	<u>(3)</u>	In an action brought under this section, the court may award actual,
20		compensatory, and punitive damages. If the court finds a private employer
21		knowingly adopted a mandatory workplace vaccination policy without first
22		confirming the safety of the vaccination based on publicly available medical
23		testing and documentation, the court shall award punitive damages not less than
24		ten thousand dollars (\$10,000).
25	<u>(4)</u>	The provisions of KRS 39A.275 shall not apply to an employer found liable under
26		this section.
27	(5)	It is the intention of the General Assembly to provide an employee a right of

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action as described in subsections (2) and (3) of this section against the
Commonwealth of Kentucky, or any of its cabinets, departments, bureaus,
agencies, or political subdivisions. The Commonwealth hereby waives its
sovereign immunity and governmental immunity defense limited solely to the
conditions described in this section. For the purposes of this section, the Board of
Claims shall be deemed to be the court of competent jurisdiction for claims
brought against public employers and shall have exclusive jurisdiction over them.
→ Section 2. Whereas it is increasingly important to provide employees equitable
recourse for harm arising from an employer-mandated vaccination policy, an emergency
is declared to exist and this Act takes effect upon its passage and approval by the
Governor or upon its otherwise becoming a law.
→ Section 3. Section 1 of this Act shall be known as the Citizen Health Mandate
Protection Act.
