

1 AN ACT relating to alcoholic beverages.

2 ***Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:***

3 ➔Section 1. KRS 243.480 is amended to read as follows:

4 (1) Upon proceedings for the revocation of any license under KRS 243.520, the
5 Alcoholic Beverage Control Board, or the local alcoholic beverage administrator,
6 may~~in its or his or her discretion~~ order a suspension of the license for any cause
7 for which it may, but is not required to, revoke the license under the provisions of
8 KRS 243.490 and 243.500. However, the licensee may have the alternative, subject
9 to the approval of the Alcoholic Beverage Control Board or the local alcoholic
10 beverage administrator, to pay in lieu of part or all of the days of any suspension
11 period, a sum as follows:

12 (a) Except for violations arising from retail sales activities, including sales under
13 licenses issued pursuant to KRS 243.086 and sales at retail under KRS
14 243.0305:

- 15 1. Distillers, rectifiers, wineries, and brewers, one thousand dollars
16 (\$1,000) per day;
17 2. Wholesale wine and distilled spirits~~liquor~~ licensees, four hundred
18 dollars (\$400) per day; and
19 3. Wholesale malt beverage~~beer~~ licensees, four hundred dollars (\$400)
20 per day;

- 21 (b) 1. Retail licensees authorized to sell distilled spirits, wine, or malt
22 beverages~~beer~~ by the package or drink, fifty dollars (\$50) per day; and
23 2. Distillers, wineries, and brewers for violations arising from their retail
24 sales activities, including sales by distillers under licenses issued
25 pursuant to KRS 243.086 and sales at retail under KRS 243.0305, fifty
26 dollars (\$50) per day; and

27 (c) All remaining licensees, fifty dollars (\$50) per day.

- 1 (2) Payments in lieu of suspension or for board-ordered agency server training,
2 collected on a cost recovery basis, collected by the Alcoholic Beverage Control
3 Board shall be deposited in the State Treasury and credited to the general
4 expenditure fund. Payments in lieu of suspension collected by local alcoholic
5 beverage administrators shall be deposited and used as local alcoholic beverage
6 license tax receipts are deposited and used.
- 7 (3) In addition to or in lieu of a suspension of a license, the board may order a licensee
8 to pay for and require attendance and completion by some or all of the licensee's
9 alcoholic beverage servers in the department's server training program.
- 10 (4) Appeals from orders of suspension and the procedure thereon shall be the same as
11 are provided for orders of revocation in KRS Chapter 13B.
