1	A RESOLUTION recognizing March 4, 2022, as PFAS Chemical Awareness Day
2	in Kentucky.
3	WHEREAS, perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl chemicals, also known as PFAS
4	chemicals, are a group of manufactured chemicals which have been used in industrial and
5	consumer products since the 1940s; and
6	WHEREAS, thousands of PFAS chemicals are known to have been developed, and
7	because of their usefulness, are contained in everyday consumer products and
8	manufacturing processes, including but not limited to fire extinguishing foam, food
9	packaging, household products, and personal care products; and
10	WHEREAS, the longevity of PFAS chemicals leads to accumulations in people,
11	animals, and the environment over time, which increases the risk of harmful effects for
12	adults, children, and animals; and
13	WHEREAS, working in occupations such as firefighting or chemical manufacturing
14	and processing, consuming water or food contaminated with PFAS chemicals, or using
15	products made with PFAS chemicals or products packaged with materials containing
16	PFAS chemicals may increase the risk of exposure and bioaccumulation over time; and
17	WHEREAS, children may be at risk of higher exposure to PFAS chemicals because
18	they drink more water, eat more food, and breathe more air per pound of body weight
19	than adults; and
20	WHEREAS, research being conducted to measure the harmful effects of exposure
21	to PFAS chemicals has shown that it may lead to decreased fertility, developmental
22	effects or delays in children, increased risk of some cancers, reduced capability of the
23	immune system to fight infections, and interference with natural hormones; and
24	WHEREAS, the prevalence of thousands of known PFAS chemicals make it
25	difficult to determine additional health effects;
26	NOW, THEREFORE,
